
Since Lu has become a mum, she relishes sharing her knowledge and enjoyment of both languages with her daughter Norah, who is one and a


half. It's been lovely to see how many Spanish words Norah is already speaking at such a young age!


As friends, we are thrilled to be starting this venture together. We will be teaching on Fridays (term time only) at 11am, Wildgoose Space, St. Werburghs.

### **Bishopston Congested Residential** Streets - Public Forum

A special public forum meeting is planned to discuss the problems of residential streets in Bishopston that suffer from the effects of road congestion. It is being organised by the Bishopston, Cotham and Redland Neighbourhood Partnership in response to local residents. Many streets in the area, including Church Road, Dongola Road, Kennington Avenue, Longmead Avenue and Nevil Road suffer from road congestion.

Several issues have been reported. They include: vehicles using the streets as short-cuts to avoid main roads at peak times: safety concerns due to speeding vehicles in residential areas; face-offs involving vehicles who cannot pass in the narrow streets, especially where there is parking on both sides; delays when delivery vehicles stop in the road because they have no space to pull in.

The public forum will allow residents to report and share the issues they face. It will also allow representatives of groups, such as the local SAFERoads campaign, to describe what they have found when monitoring their roads. Possible approaches to address the issues will be considered. including their advantages and disadvantages. So this will be a chance to look at options and see what support they have from residents. The results of the meeting will help inform the Neighbourhood Partnership in making recommendations to Bristol City Council about future road schemes.

Chair of the BCR NP Sustainable Travel group, Roger Gimson, said, "There is a very limited budget for road schemes in our area, so it is important that every penny is spent wisely and with the full support of local residents"

The forum will take place on Tuesday 27 September, 7–9pm, at the Horfield Quaker Meeting House, 300 Gloucester Road, Bishopston, and is open to the public.

Anyone will have an opportunity to speak, but if you have something specific you would like to say on behalf of the residents in your street, please let the Neighbourhood Partnership know (info@bcrnp.org. uk).



### How businesses along Gloucester Road are doing their bit for carers

If you know someone who is a carer looking after a family member or friend in Bristol or South Gloucestershire, tell them about the Carers Emergency Card. Over 4,500 carers in Bristol and South Gloucestershire carry the card in case they are taken seriously ill or have an accident or emergency that prevents them from caring. It ensures the person they look after gets vital help through the local authority, and this is a free service.

Cardholders are also able to access discounts as part of the Carers Emergency Card Benefits scheme. If you know someone who runs a business, tell them traders can offer discounts to carers by linking up with Carers Support Centre. Over 150 local traders already offer discounts on days out, relaxation, therapies, retail and eating out. Carers show their Carers Emergency Card to claim discounts.

Keith Sinclair, Chief Executive of Carers Support Centre, said: "We are inviting businesses to support carers and show they are 'carer-friendly' by joining the Carers Emergency Card Benefits Scheme.

"Caring is an issue that touches many people. Locally, 2 out of 5 people will become carers at some time in their lives. There are 68,000 carers in Bristol and South Gloucestershire and the time and care they give saves local health and social care services a staggering £1.19 billion every year."

Amy Flood is a carer who looks after her disabled son. She said: "Having a Carers Emergency Card has offered me real peace of mind, and these additional new discounts are a wonderful idea. It's lovely to know that so many traders have opted in... it's great for the local community, and being part of the scheme will hopefully see businesses benefit from some extra trade, too!"





### **News from Fairfield High School**

### 'Making lab' opens up exciting possibilities at FHS

Students at Fairfield High School will soon be literally at the cutting edge of digital technology. The school has won a £35,000 grant from the Wolfson Foundation to install a Making Lab, where students can create 'almost anything'.

For the first time, they will be able to design products on computers and then build them using digital fabrication technology. There will be a particular emphasis on robots and electronic devices. The new design studio and lab, which will be ready for use in September, opens up many possibilities for further development of GCSE courses in engineering, computer science, science, fine art, graphics and photography.

Local primary schools will also be able to benefit from the improved facilities and it is hoped that in time the project might be upgraded to a Fab Lab.

Assistant Principal Vanetta Spence said the introduction of the CAD/CAM (computer aided design/computer aided technology) technology and the digitally controlled machines and tools was very exciting for the school.

### The launch of 'You Are Not Alone'

'You Are Not Alone' is a short film by four Fairfield High School students, which encourage children and young people experiencing abuse to seek help. The film can be viewed via https://www.youtube. com/watch?v=nv1ojj4VGIE

The campaign and film, made by Shushana Seymour-Grigg, Nadia Shamow, Rahma Osman and Freya Parsons for the annual Sharp Shotz competition, combines interviews with animations to help and encourage young people to engage with the variety of help that is out there, and to understand and believe that ultimately - 'You Are Not Alone'.





The FHS students worked as writers, directors, production team and campaign leaders on the project. FHS is the official school partner for Sharp Shotz, which was founded in 2007 to give young people the chance to highlight social issues, working with charities and other partners including the BBC. UWE Bristol and Aardman.

Head of Arts at FHS David Otlet comments: "Sharp Shotz is a unique project. It provides a great way to link English, arts, humanities and personal, health, social and emotional education in a way that really means something to students. Congratulations to our students, whose film was chosen as one of the winning entries."



## You can give blood locally

Blood donations are vital for helping save and improve lives. Each donation can help up to three people.

Craig Shellard, (pictured right), knows just what an amazing gift blood donation is. The 35-yearold received numerous transfusions of blood and platelets after being diagnosed with a type of blood cancer called Follicular Lymphoma.

"I took it relatively well, the most difficult part was telling family and friends," said Craig. "At the time it was considered non-curable." After the cancer was diagnosed in 2008 Craig began a treatment journey that took many years. Both cancer and chemotherapy damage the body's bone marrow. which is where blood and platelets are produced. Blood transfusions are a vital part of treatment for many cancer patients. Unfortunately Craig's cancer returned after treatment and he also needed a stem cell transplant - receiving both his own stem cells and stem cells from his brother in 2013. When Craig then developed Graft Versus Host Disease – his immune system started attacking his own body - he was given only a 10 per cent chance of survival. Craig had specialist treatment at NHS Blood and Transplant's Therapeutic Apheresis unit in Bristol, and a further blood transfusion. He recovered gradually and was able to return to work as a



business analyst in spring 2016. Craig said: "I have needed many blood products over the years and I am indebted to donors for the help I received."

Blood is always needed and hospitals in England rely on around 6,000 units a day to treat patients. NHS Blood and Transplant particularly needs people with blood groups O negative, B negative, AB negative and A negative to come forward, and people from Black and South Asian communities.

Bristol's blood donor centre is on the grounds of Southmead Hospital and it is open every week day and everyother week day with free parking and wifi. Please make and keep your appointment to donate this summer by calling 0300 123 23 23 or visit www.blood.co.uk



# **SENDaWelcome**

Three Bishopston mums are inviting local people to join their mission to 'SENDaWelcome' to every member of our community.

I caught up with Katz, Julie and Viviana at one of the new, inclusive kids' events at Golden Hill Community Garden. These inspirational women took some time out to share with me their mission and how their strap line - 'Local people building inclusive communities' - came about.

The three women met at a neighbourly house party hosted by Viviana and her family when they first moved to the area. While chatting, they discovered they all had a child with SEND (Special educational needs and disability). They began to meet up for coffee and share their frustration at the lack of support for people with special needs in our area, and the negative impact this has on both the individuals requiring the care and the family unit as a whole. They all told me how their children with SEND had to attend different schools across the city and that attending the same social clubs or activities as their siblings could often prove difficult.

It is both sad and disruptive for all family members when siblings cannot join in with the same groups. All of the women had found it extremely hard-work to attempt to have their child with SEND included in a local children's activity, as it requires endless phone calls, forms to be completed, as well as applying for additional funding. Katz told me, "Trying to coordinate all of these things can be too much of a challenge. The result of these and other barriers means children with SEND can become isolated in their own communities." The trio therefore decided to join forces and appeal to the good people of Bishopston to assist them in their plight.

We live in a fantastic community with wonderful green spaces, opportunities for children and a buzzing high street; SENDaWelcome would like these resources to be obtainable by all community members. Sadly, we do not see many people with special needs involved in local activity, and this needs to change.

The first positive step was taken over the summer holidays, when SENDaWelcome's first project successfully took place. Three inclusive activity days for all children took place at the Golden Hill Community Garden. They were so popular that a waiting list was necessary - proof in itself for the need for such events. The women would like to thank Lucy for organising such a wonderful day of activities with a sensory walk, hammocks, pond dipping, treasure trails... which were embraced and enjoyed by all. Thanks also goes to the Bishopston, Cotham and Redland Neighbourhood Partnership for their funding.



This, however, is just the start; although brilliant, these activity days need to build into something more widespread and sustainable. SENDaWelcome are looking to build a 'model of good practice' in Bishopston for people with special needs that can be shared and celebrated across Bristol and beyond.

### People of Bishopston - we need you!

Katz, Julie and Viviana are well aware that this is quite an undertaking, which they cannot achieve alone. They are however confident, as I am, that the good people of Bishopston will rise to the challenge and come together to make this happen.

What SENDaWelcome needs the most at this time is to build a team of local volunteers who have the time and aptitude to work with people with special needs, to enable the child to take part in mainstream local activities. Any existing skills or experience in this area is welcomed but training is also possible. With the help of volunteers, the group is also keen to work with local traders to enable people with SEND to access and be welcomed to local shops. as well as the possibility of some work experience and employment. Julie told me, "All it often needs is for local businesses to have the confidence to spend time with the individual. We hope to support this with awareness raising and training."

I think this is a fantastic idea! My passion and pride for this area is consistently well documented in the pages of Bishopston Matters. We live in a wonderful area that has so much to offer, it is time these resources are made available to all. We need to take the time to think of all the members of our community - come on Bishopston, we can make this happen!

# **Lungworm Club**

In recent years a new worm has been seen in the UK and is now posing a risk to the health of our dogs, as we see more cases in Bristol. The worm, Angiostrongylus

vasorum, was initially found in France and is now travelling across all of Europe. It is thought that climate change could be the reason that we're seeing the worm here.

The worm is spread by slugs and snails: most often these are eaten accidentally by the dog while the slug or snail is crawling across a food bowl or chew. Once in the dog, the larvae mature into adults in the heart, travelling into the lungs causing much damage and then via the trachea to the intestines; they then pass out as larvae in faeces to be eaten by a slug or snail, and the cycle starts again.

Clinical signs are seen just a few weeks after ingestion of the larvae and are related to the respiratory tract. You may notice a cough or breathing difficulties, initially. Other signs can be weight loss, poor appetite, vomiting or diarrhoea, bleeding, anaemia or tiring easily. The signs can be quite non-specific and easily confused with other conditions.

A blood test that can be performed in the consult room while you wait is available for diagnosis.

Treatment is usually successful if the disease is caught early enough. If left untreated, a potentially fatal pneumonia may develop.

There is no risk to human health or to cats from Angiostrongylus.

Prevention is definitely better than cure. Worming to protect your dog has to be with a specific licensed product that treats lungworm, which is only available from your vet. The wormer has to be given monthly to be effective at prevention.

To help owners with monthly compliance. Animal Health Centre has set up a 'Lunaworm Club' for all clients who



wish to treat their dog monthly. The club gives you 25% discount on an effective wormer as we recognise that this can be expensive to dose monthly and we want to encourage as many as possible to do so.

### Horfield Common Wildlife Plan 'My Wild Park'

It's been a wonderful summer on Horfield Common with people of all ages enjoying this wonderful green space for recreation and play. The Friends have been busy behind the scenes working on a range of projects including our partnership with Avon Wildlife Trust 'Mv Wild Park'.

The planting of the new 'Fruit & Nut' hedgerow around the Ardagh earlier in the year completed the Horfield Common Tree Planting plan, which FOHC volunteers had worked on over the previous

4 years, our new pond dipping platform was installed earlier this year, and the

fencing around the pond repaired. The wildlife and biodiversity group is now turning its full attention to the Horfield Common Wildlife plan, which is likely to take a similar timescale to deliver.

Following a number of consultation events. through which lots of local people have fed into the developing plans for improvements which can support increased wildlife and biodiversity on the common, we met with Bristol City Council Parks Department and the My Wild City project officer to agree a final plan for the common, and to discuss how to take the project forward. Changes to the way in which green spaces in the city are managed have to be co-ordinated between a range of partners. As landowners. Bristol City Council is responsible for the maintenance of the common - including, for example, the frequency at which grassed areas are

FOHC is discussing with BCC and AWT how local volunteers can enhance this maintenance programme, for the benefit of wildlife in the area for example, removing the cuttings from allocated areas following mowing (BCC's equipment cannot do this, hence why cuttings are left), which will enable them begin to 're-wild' - encouraging pollinator species and other native plants to reestablish.

We will keep everyone updated with any plans for changes to the maintenance regime, and any opportunities to come along and get involved in practical conservation activities on the common. If you are interested and would like to get involved, please do get in touch.



We were delighted to welcome RHS judge, lan, to the Ardagh on 28 July to see the work that volunteers have done over the last year at the Ardagh and around the wider common. The idea for the 'Fruit & Nut' hedgerow was borne out of lan's visit last year, so it was wonderful to be able to show him the new hedgerow - an incredible achievement of 0.4 km of new hedgerow planted, which so many local people got involved in – along with the gardens inside the Ardagh, which you will have seen being transformed over the last 12

months; and the wonderful planting around the café, which has helped to establish the café as such a wonderful new community space. We will hear the outcome of the visit and judging

later in the summer, and we'll keep you posted fingers crossed!

### **Charity Fundraiser – Summer 2016!**

On 6 August the team at the Café on the Common hosted a Summer Picnic and BBQ which was well attended by local residents of all ages, and

thoroughly enjoyed! Following the BBQ, Café Manager Sara and FOHC Vice-Chair, Fiona, took centre stage as they had their heads shaved, 'Braving the Shave' for charity. Sara was raising money for Macmillan Cancer Care, and Fiona for Children's Hospice South West. Between them, they have raised more than £1500, which is a fantastic achievement – well done to both of them, and thank you very much to all who gave so generously to their fundraising campaigns. 

Andy Bowles, BDP's Older People's Service Worker, highlights the need for peer support when addressing this issue among Bristol's older population: "If you are visited by someone of a similar age who has had a similar experience, you'll feel less judged, more comfortable and more able to accept help, hopefully,"

Bristol Ageing Better, a partnership of organisations working together to reduce loneliness and isolation among older people in Bristol, recognises peer support groups as a key element to address social isolation. **Local History Matters** Hunting in Horfield

BHA local history research – text by Andy Buchan ©

In 1285, Edward I granted freewarren to John de Marina, abbot of St Augustine's Bristol, and lord of the manor of Horfield. The grant gave the abbot exclusive rights

over the hunting of small game

and vermin (hare, partridge, fox, rat, etc.). It allowed him to hunt on his own demesne, typically with hawks, dogs or ferrets. Rabbits (i.e. coneys) had been introduced into Britain in the early-13th century and were much prized as food. They were bred in Horfield on the hillside above Cutlers Mills brook as it descended to Coniger bridge, across ground still known at the parish tithe survey in 1841 as East & West Conygre (tithe nos. 2–3).

Where there was game, there was also poaching. George Bennett, John Adlam and William Thomas were charged in 1700 with keeping hunting dogs (Canis veneticus) without a licence, and James Higgs, William Kingsbury and Samuel Vowles were charged in 1794 with keeping 'several Lurching and other Dogs...to the great Inconvenience of Parishioners'. Mere possession of a lurcher, a cross-breed, part-collie, part-greyhound, might lead to prosecution. William Dymock, on the other hand, seems to have held a licence. One part of his tenancy agreement in 1652 was a payment in kind of woodhen, valued at ij.d (two pence).

Deer were also hunted in Horfield. EP Shirley in Some Account of English Deer Parks (1867) distinguished between parks and haves = OE hedge. Hayes were not intended for the permanent preservation of deer, but as a means to entrap them from the wild. 'From the hayes they could be transferred to parks securely fenced with wooden pales, whence they were hunted when it was the pleasure of the king or owner'. Horfield had no deer park but it had a deer haves, a combination of banks, ditches, fences or walls best adapting the landscape to its function. The Horfield tithe survey shows a cluster of four contiguous fields named 'Allhays' (tithe nos 61–3–4–5), the whole roughly elliptical in shape. It is very clear that Quab Farm's curtilage (tithe no. 60) had been taken from Allhays (tithe no. 61) and that the field called Golden Hill (tithe no. 64) was contemporary with the rest of the Allhays cluster. In other words, the Horfield haves dated from the time of the Abbey. One essential feature of the hayes (or of deer enclosures in general) was 'some little brooke of spring-water running along by the place'. Horfield's hayes contained 22 acres 1 rood, 11 perches. Its spring was known as Colwell in 1488 and its perennial



to run alongside the highway.

Another essential feature of a haves was a leapgate, and Horfield manorial records contained half a dozen references to it. All of them said roughly the same thing: that the gate needed repairing and/or hanging and that certain named tenants were responsible for repairs by a given date. As to its more exact location, the leap-gate was said to lead to the common and it was near Hall hevs lane-gate, which also led to the common. The last mention of the Horfield leap-gate was in October 1751. Sometime between that date and the late-19th century publication of the Oxford English Dictionary (OED), the word 'leap-gate' became obsolete. The OED's definition – 'a low gate in a fence which can be leaped by deer, while keeping sheep from straying' - was misleading, since it left out the whole idea of entrapment. In fact, the design of the haves boundary led the deer to entrap themselves. They could leap into the haves but not out of it. Cantor's definition in The English Medieval Landscape is typical. A leap-gate was 'a device which enabled deer to enter the park but not to leave it'.

### **New Library on Track Again**

Work has re-commenced on the old Bristol North Baths site which, when completed, will house the new Bishopston Library among other facilities. At the present time there is no confirmed date for the completion of the work.

Cheltenham Road Library remains open for business as usual, although it will be put on the market for sale in the near future. There is still time for people to leave their ideas and thoughts about the new building at the Wishing Tree in the foyer. The library service is particularly keen to establish a Friends Group for the new library and would like to hear from anyone interested in finding out more about this. Kate Murray, Head of Libraries said, "We believe that an active Friends Group can be a vital part of shaping the life of the new facility. Working in partnership with the library staff, they can act as a link to the local community, helping




to deliver a range of events and activities that can make the library a real focus for everyone in the area."

the Lawn Tennis Association, Sports funding bodies and community business funders to explore how we may be able to bring together a complex funding 'jigsaw', which will enable us to submit a comprehensive and robust business case to complete the Community Asset Transfer for the site before the end of 2016. It has been fantastic to welcome new Bishopston Councillors,

Tom Brook and Eleanor Combley to the Ardagh several times since the recent elections. Both have already been actively pursuing a range of potential opportunities for support for the project, bringing officers from a range of departments together to discuss how planning and opportunities for progressing the project can be supported. We would also like to use this opportunity to thank outgoing Bishopston Councillors, Daniella Radice and Tim Malnick for their consistent support and significant work to support local residents to enable the project to progress during their time in office.

At the FOMG meeting were representatives from The Bishopston Society and from Sporting Memories (who run reminiscence workshops for senior citizens). Other new members included local residents interested in honouring the fallen, preserving the heritage sport site, community welfare and the economic wellbeing of the area. as well as those with concerns about previous unsuitable planning proposals and air pollution. Some local councillors, our MP and the Royal British Legion are also supportive.

FOMG will strive to secure a future for the sports ground that respects what it is: Bristol's largest most significant and most effective - war memorial. Obviously it is neither respectful nor appropriate to discuss war memorials in terms of real estate. as brown field development sites. A great future for Bristol's most famous sports ground beckons, starting perhaps with a key role next year, as Bristol becomes the UK's European City of Sport.

# **News from our Bishopston & Redland Councillors**

### **Bristol North Baths**

Finally, there are builders on site! We can now dare to hope that our long-awaited new Bishopston library will materialise early next year (after fitting out). We've been told that the flats should be ready for occupants within a few months, and new public toilets, too. In the meantime, if you have any thoughts on what the new library should look like, or extra services it could offer, then do get in touch, as we all want the new facility to meet the needs of local people as much as possible. There's a new Friends of the Library group being set up and people with ideas for running community activities are going to make a key contribution to a thriving facility. ### **Ashley Down Green**

Work has started at Ashley Down Green on the new play area and access from Stoney Lane. The project is anticipated to continue until mid-October. ### Wetherspoon's

Wetherspoon's has put in another application to convert 349-353 Gloucester Road into one of their establishments. While we would love to see this building back in use for the community, and while Wetherspoon's has improved their application since last time, there are still issues with the application. These include noise, the impact on other businesses

(cafes and restaurants as well as pubs). anti-social behaviour, and the fact that the

building lies within the Gloucester Road Cumulative Impact Area. To this end, Tom and Eleanor will both be submitting oppositions to the application. (Just a reminder, you can view and comment on all city planning applications at: www.planningonline.bristol. gov.uk/online-applications).

The Bishopston Redland and Cotham Neighbourhood Partnership Community Fair takes place on September 17, 12,30-4,30pm at St Michael's Church Hall on Gloucester Rd. Come along and find out more about the local Neighbourhood Partnership and get involved in local groups that make a real difference to our area. There will be stalls, entertainment and food plus reports on last year's Little Grants, what the local neighbourhood initiatives are up to, and how you can help with things like highway schemes, parks, street scene and much more. If you have an idea that needs a small injection of cash, then ask us about the Little Grants fund which will be allocated at the fair. ### **Redland High School**

You may have noticed that the school site is now up for sale. This is clearly an important space (with listed buildings) so we will be doing our best to see that any future uses meet the needs of local people as far as we can. We have also asked the council to investigate whether part of the site could be used to meet any additional needs within nearby Redland Green School.

At 2.9 acres, it's likely to be the largest development in Redland ward for many years and we'd like to ensure local residents get a say in what happens next on this site.

### Residents parking changes

Finally, the legal Traffic Regulation Orders are being advertised to make the long-awaited extensions to the Redland and Cotham residents parking zones so that they can include areas at the north of Redland Rd. Subject to the consultation, this will come as a relief to many residents who have been suffering the effects of displacement parking. There will also be a variety of minor changes to the current schemes to take account of feedback.

Just to reiterate, there are no firm plans as yet for any new zones, or indeed to remove existing ones. The Mayor has, however, indicated that any new

plans must have the support of both residents and councillors, so get in touch with us with any views.

### Front garden bike sheds

Martin had some case work about planning enforcement to remove bike sheds in gardens. Structures in front of houses need planning permissions and this may not be granted. But there seemed a clear anomaly that parts of the council are encouraging more cycling, supporting bike training and loans, and we're promoting storage hangars in streets, plus making the city more cyclefriendly, but planners were responding to complaints by telling people they had to remove secure bike storage. It emerged there is no guidance on what could be permitted and how to ensure a structure that helps provide storage without breaking rules. After asking questions of the Mayor in May and liaising with the council's transport and development management teams the good news is there is now a draft being developed to explain what to do to ensure storage meets permitted rules. Apparently fifteen different locations across the city were subject of notices to remove bike sheds with no guidance on how to make them legal.

### **Bus changes**

We have had a lot of correspondence from residents over the First Bus changes to services for bus numbers 8, 9 and 72, which start on 4 September. The route of the no. 72 bus will be amended to adopt the route of the cancelled Wessex no. 19 service. This will allow passengers to have continued access to both universities and will operate every 30 minutes Monday to Saturday. This is hopefully welcome news to those who were affected by the 19's cancellation! The 8 and 9 will now run separate services with a connection at stops by Redland station.

If you use these services, please do check the amended timetables before setting out. It's probably worth pointing out that, as these services are not subsidised by the council, we have very limited influence over decisions made by First Bus. We are, however, very concerned by the potential impact of the changes and are considering a meeting with First Bus to represent residents over the matter.

### **Highways projects**

We're expecting the construction of local highway projects by the gates of St Andrews Park and at the North Rd end of Cromwell Rd as we write. These, and the Sommerville Rd traffic calming scheme, are now in Ashley ward, but were developed when the area was in Redland ward. The good news is a local scheme has also been under construction at Halsbury Rd to make the crossing safe for

residents. We're now supporting residents on Cranbrook Rd who are concerned about the need for a safe crossing, following some minor collisions involving local children and cars.

In other news: Fi has been kept busy with her new Cabinet role which covers health and wellbeing across the city. Broadly, this includes areas such as sport and activity, food policy, alcohol and tobacco but mainly trying to make sure that a public health perspective is built into all areas of the council's work. It's been a steep but interesting learning


