

Baby Bites Local Cookery Workshops - something for all the family



Baby Bites cookery workshops are now being run in Bishopston, by local mum Amy. The sessions are designed to help parents cook healthy and delicious food for their families.

without spending hours slaving over the stove, or seeking out rare ingredients! There are also fun cookery classes for children – from pre-school to school age, to get everyone involved in making food!

At the classes for adults, parents will build their confidence and learn recipes for tasty simple meals that are suitable for the whole family – from the baby up.

They leave with delicious samples of food that they have cooked, as well as clear information about childhood nutrition. All the workshops are really relaxed and fun – and you can even bring your little one along! Classes are 2.5 hours and you can choose from: Weaning (£35) for those who are just introducing solid food; Fingers foods (£35) which is great for everyone from babies to school age children as packed lunch ideas; and Family foods (£40) which is main meals that everyone can enjoy together.

The kids' cookery classes are lots of fun and totally hands on. The children get to make new dishes each time they come, and are always very proud of their creations! It's a great way of introducing kids to the fun of cooking while learning new skills and gaining an understanding of different ingredients and flavours.

For pre-school children Amy runs weekday classes in the mornings once a week, and also a monthly Saturday cookery club for 3–8 year olds. These are 1.5 hours and cost £20/child, or £35 for two siblings. If you book in for more than one class a month there is also a £5 discount. Amy also offers cooking parties for birthdays – including make your own pizzas, chocolate fun and cupcake decorating.





New Super Bike designed in St Andrews!

A new bike company, Snowdon Bike, has been set up by long-time St Andrews resident Tim Snowdon. I asked him why and he laughed, "No one was building the bike I wanted. So I decided to build my own! It's taken me a year to get everything right. but now the Snowdon Paradox is finished, and it's everything I had hoped for."

The Paradox is a UK-made, flat bar road bike that is constructed out of grade 9 titanium. It's designed to offer real world speed and control. It does this by using the marginal gains concept – used so brilliantly by British Cycling – and applying it to both speed and

I was interested to know what Tim would like his Snowdon Bike to be known for? "Brits (and particularly Bristolians) are famous for creativity, for individuality, for invention and, in particular, for quality engineering. They are also good at combining traditional design with cutting-edge thinking. This is what I want Snowdon Bike to be known for. I am proud to be able to build on Bristol's engineering heritage with a beautiful bike that is hand built in the UK."



Fairlawn School an exciting discovery

A new generation of learners is breathing life into the historic buildings that once housed Fairfield Grammar School in Bristol.

Children aged 4 to 6 are enjoying a great start to their education at Fairlawn School, a new primary in the converted Victorian school in Montpelier. The school run by the CGS Trust, is now in its second year. By 2021 it will have up to 420 pupils aged 4 to 11.

The first group of children to complete the reception year achieved excellent results, with 69% reaching a Good Level of Development (GLD), above the Bristol and national averages (both 66.3%).

Fairlawn School's vision is "academic success and holistic development for all children". Staff work closely with families and others in the community as well as partner schools in the trust to create opportunities that build pupils' confidence and curiosity.

The curriculum has a strong emphasis on STEAM subjects - science, technology, engineeering, arts and mathematics. Last month, Year 1 children enjoyed an inspiring "build a plane" workshop with volunteers from Airbus. The school also uses the local environment as a focus for learning, including regular Forest School visits.



The 1898 school buildings in Fairlawn Road have undergone an impressive conversion, maintaining their charm and character while creating bright and spacious facilities for 21st century learning. An exciting new outdoor play area has completed the conversion.

Headteacher Julie Molesworth said: "It is such a privilege to be the custodian of such a magnificent piece of Victorian architecture. Our children are fascinated by the history of the building. It is helping to stimulate a passion for learning."

The school already has a strong parent-teacher association, which is organising a Winter Fair on Saturday 3 December, 3-5pm.

There are also opportunities to see the school at open evenings on Thursday December 8 and Tuesday January 10, both 6-7.30pm.

FOHC Review a busy 2016!

As we are coming to the close of 2016, it is a good opportunity to review our progress to date, and start to think about priorities for the coming year.

Following years of work, it has been wonderful to see so much activity transforming the common and bringing the quality of this wonderful green space up to the same levels as other parks in the area. The issues caused by the position of the common across multiple electoral, planning and administrative boundaries and the lack of holistic planning for the area had led to a series of poor decisions for the park, which is a wonderful asset for local residents.

That aside, we have made excellent progress. Following 4 years' work, Wellington Hill Playing Field was registered as a Village Green – giving it the highest level of protection possible currently to prevent further proposals to build on it. We owe our success in this to a wonderful local man, and

barrister; without his support pro bono – we could not have won this, and the informal 5k route is called the 'Daniel Bennet 5k' in some kind of small recognition and thanks to him for this.

In the last 2 years, the café on the common has opened in a previously disused and derelict yard at the Ardagh and has transformed the use of the area. Within the plan

for the site to become a hub for the community, it will also enable a sustainable future for Ardagh Bowling Club, which, despite being resident at the site for 90 years, is not able - on its own - to meet the council's requirements for the community asset transfer process. Horfield Common Community Interest Company was established late in 2015 to take forward this project and the establishment of this is a considerable achievement for all involved

Congratulations to all who have contributed to this: FoHC wish Project Ardagh the very best for the next stages of this project. You can read more about this - and how you can get involved to on page 44.

A Productive month for Project Ardagh!



architects from the Masters programme at UWE come and work with us on site and respond to all the data we have been gathering through the summer survey and earlier consultations. They have been doing a sterling job at looking at how the entire site works and how it

can be improved in light of our ambitions for the site's regeneration.

The architects undertook further consultation - inviting representatives of all the various stakeholders, potential service users, local residents, neighbourhood partnerships and more to come along to the Ardagh to feedback and discuss their thoughts and ideas so far. The focused session was extremely well attended (so much so we had to relocate venue from the cosy warm container with the wood burner providing seasonal 'hygge' in order to get everyone in!) and enabled useful conversations to take place in the break-out groups to flourish and feedback into the project. The responses from both the architects a those attending was that it was a very useful and informative session that got people really seeing exciting potential in the regeneration of the Ardag site, making it more tangible for all to understand and bring the project one step closer to being a reality! The Masters architects will be presenting a final working proposal and model of the building in the coming weeks, which we will be excited to reveal at a public meeting in the coming months.

We have all been working extremely hard trying to secure funding and we have a number of applications to The People's Health Trust, Architectural Heritage fund as well as BCC's Impact Fund, all with a view to work on improving the Ardagh site and the activities it can bring to the community. FOHC Chair, Sam, has been doing an amazing job working on the business plan for the Community Asset Transfer and we are now just working on the finishing touches before final submission to the council.

Can you help deliver this community project - please?

We are working hard on a sustainable plan for the future of the Ardagh site and are in a

strong position to be successful in our application for a community asset transfer. We are now seeking local people who are willing to contribute to the project (specifically people with Legal, Finance. Heart Murmurs in Cats: a new blood test!



Many healthy cats can have heart murmurs that are not related to heart disease. However, some cats with murmurs will have heart disease, which can occur in relatively young cats. Some breeds of cat such as Bengal, Maine Coon and Sphynx cats are at higher risk of heart disease.

Doctors use blood tests for cardiac biomarkers if they suspect a heart attack in a person; vets now have a test that they can use to measure for one called NTproBNP, a hormone released when your cat's heart muscle is stretched or under stress. The blood test will cost only £29 at our practice and is a very useful screening tool!

A positive result suggests that your cat may have underlying heart disease. The next advisable step is for your cat to have a heart scan at a referral practice, which we can arrange for you. Some cats with a positive result will not currently have significant heart disease, however, it is important to rule this out with a heart scan. 98% of cats with a negative blood test do not have significant heart disease currently. We will monitor the murmur at their annual health check and booster vaccination with the option of annual blood tests.

Your cat may well be absolutely fine if we do not perform the blood test; however, if they do have an underlying heart disease, this may worsen over time without our knowledge. Heart failure can cause symptoms that appear suddenly with your cat struggling to breathe or breathing very guickly due to fluid around their lungs or in their abdomen. They can also develop clots that lodge in an important artery supplying their back legs leading to sudden paralysis (dragging their back legs).

This condition has an extremely poor prognosis and is very painful. Any of these symptoms would be a reason to call a vet straight away.

If your cat is diagnosed with heart disease, the vet may prescribe medications for their specific condition or to protect against blood clots. They will also offer advice for monitoring your cat for disease progression. You can monitor their breathing rate at home when they are resting and relaxed – all you do is count how many times they are breathing in a minute; this will tell you what is normal for them, then regularly check to see if there has been any change. If your cat is putting more effort into breathing or their rate is increasing, then give us a call as this can be an indicator that the heart disease is progressing. There are smartphone apps that can help you with this.



NLEs along with staff in their school use their success and professionalism to provide additional leadership capability in other schools.

NLEs are deployed to suit the needs of each school needing support. The type

of support provided is flexible and can sometimes involve NLEs becoming executive headteachers. They also have responsibility for developing the next generation of NLEs and national support schools.

Catriona Mangham comments: "In recognition of the amazing work done at FHS to improve the outcomes of students, and also the incredible work staff do to support other schools, we have been awarded the recognition of being a national support school and myself an NLE. We are very proud of our collective achievements and look forward to sharing our enthusiasm and wisdom with others."

It is not only the adults who have recently been recognised publicly – the results have just been announced from FHS's Science Photography Competition and, the standard from students was very high. The theme this year was 'colour', with the requirement simply to 'use any device to take a photo of something that represents colour to you'.

Over 50 entries were received; with the panel finally narrowing them down to three, who each received LOVE vouchers: 1st Place: Leon Prentice, Year 9 2nd Place: Lily Davies, Year 8 and 3rd Place: Suraya Hernandez, Year 9.

It was a pleasurable, but tough job to study each entry in detail in order to decipher who deserved the first. second and third prize. 
Bristol North Drop In will be dazzling passers-by with a special Bristol-themed window at Gloucester County Cricket Club, who are involved for the second year running.

Bishopston based - Women's Independent Alcohol Support



At the recent BCR Community Fair, a grant was won by the local charity Women's Independent Alcohol Support (WIAS), to set up a new 'drop by' at the Bishopston Boston Tea Party, on Friday morning. It is an informal opportunity to find out more about healthy alcohol use, in a relaxed setting. WIAS also runs a helpline on Wednesday evenings, offers one-to-one counselling, and regularly runs small groups to help women with managing alcohol use and improving mental and physical health. The 'drop by' takes place in one of the Boston Tea Party booths, from 10-12 on a Friday, and is advertised by a small WIAS sign on the table.

Bishopston resident, Patsy Staddon, who founded the organisation, herself recovered from severe alcohol issues many years ago. She later obtained a doctorate in the sociology of women's alcohol use and its treatment, and has

published widely and academically on the importance of gender in the causes and the treatment of alcohol misuse. The organisation brings together the expertise of women in the fields of domestic abuse, mental health and counselling. It is grounded in first-hand knowledge of the different ways that women can learn to drink more safely, or, where appropriate, to live happily without alcohol. For women, there can be a great deal of fear around looking into their alcohol use - they are expected to behave responsibly, and alcohol can be seen to compromise their suitability, for example, to look after children. When WIAS was set up, its motto therefore was 'No blame, no shame'. Most people can develop alcohol problems. Most people can recover.

The 'drop by' is operated by two volunteers from WIAS and carries information from Alcohol Concern, and other useful material to help keep an eye on your alcohol intake. We are easy to talk to - come and have a coffee with us!

The exciting project to put giant Gloucester Road Art Banners on lamp posts is now underway. Word has spread among the Bristol art community. Artist submissions are already coming in, with some wellknown artists confirming they will be putting forward designs. You can find examples on the Facebook page GloucesterRdArtBanners. Local artists Laura Robertson and Bev Cavendar have offered to help the children put together designs for their local schools. Bishop Road School has confirmed they will be running a programme of activities with the children to produce artwork, as two of their teachers Safa Aslm and Debby Bird – are local artists.

Sarah Thorp, owner of Room 212, is the driving force behind this project: she is aware that traders and customers would like more art on the street and was inspired by her neighbour, artist Deborah Weinreb, who put up banners in Horfield and Lockleaze as part of last year's community art project, Bristol 2015. She asked Debs to help with the logistics for Gloucester Road.

It is hoped the installation of the banners will encourage people to wander our high street, from Stokes Croft to Southmead, and enjoy the art and all the independent shops, businesses, bars, cafes and friendly community. The project is being funded by Gloucester Road traders and our local Neighbourhood Partnership with help from North Bristol Artists. The majority of funds for the project are in place but a bit more funding would be welcome further down the line maybe a bit of crowdfunding – so please watch this space!

The Gloucester Road Art Banners will act as a massive outdoor

art gallery covering 2 miles from Colston's Girls' School to Horfield Common, for up to 5 years, and EVERYONE is invited to put forward their art ideas. The M Shed have expressed interest in holding an exhibition of the artwork in the summer, when the banners will be launched. Individual artists, groups and societies are encouraged to put on their creative thinking caps. The deadline is February 2017.

There is a great team of judges lined up, from an academician at the RWA to Assistant Mayor (for Neighbourhoods) Asher Craig.

Ashley Down Traffic Regulation Order

We have been told

that Council Officers have now started analysing the feedback from the consultation on double yellow lines in the Ashley Down area. The results should therefore be released in the next few months. Once we know the results and recommendations made, we'll let local residents know.

Congested Streets Forum – We mentioned last month that the Bishopston, Cotham and Redland Neighbourhood Partnership ran a very successful public Forum in September to discuss causes of, and proposed solutions for, Bishopston and Ashley Down's congested streets. The results from the Forum have now been published and are now available at: http://www.bcrnp.org.uk/bishopstoncongested-streets/

We will be using this information to decide on where to concentrate our efforts and funds going forward, in collaboration with local residents. If anyone is interested in getting involved in the Neighbourhood Partnership and/or as an organiser for their local area, we'd be very happy to hear from you.

Council Draft Corporate Strategy -

The council's draft 2017–2022 Corporate Strategy has been released. This includes what the council and mayor want to achieve over the next five years. It also includes possible solutions to the council's budget gap of at least £92 million, which is a result of continued central government austerity and an ineffectiveness of previous savings initiatives. This is an extremely important document for all who live in Bristol, and a public consultation is now underway – please have your say! You can access the

consultation at the following address, and we

would be happy to help with any questions you may have: www.bristol.gov.uk/corpstrategy – the survey closes on 5 January 2017.

Cricket Ground Flats Parking – The City of Bristol College and the Cricket Club, who co-own the car park on College Road, are intending on introducing restrictions on when residents will be able to park in the car park, and charges for parking there during other periods.

We met with the college, the club, the management company and residents' representatives to discuss the plans. It has been agreed that there will now be no charges for using the car park at off-peak times, which is great news for local residents as off-peak charges were originally proposed. Also, the grace period before a fine is issued at peak times will be 45-60 minutes (to be confirmed), and it will be possible to pay to park at peak times. This will be on an incremental but quickly increasing scale so as to allow cost-effective parking for short-term visitors (e.g. maintenance workers, carers, etc.), but to discourage all-day parking. Furthermore, Disabled Badge holders will be able to park for free at all times. Brunel Field School will have spaces allocated for their staff, and there may be the possibility of specific agreements for residents who regularly need to park at peak times. The scheme is planned to be in place in January.

All in all, we think this is a workable solution that will balance the competing needs of the college, club, school and residents. We will continue to argue for the best policy for the whole community throughout the scheme's implementation and operation.

Redland ward news

No. 9 Bus — Following a meeting between councillors and First Group, we are receiving reports of unreliability of the no. 9 bus. Given it now has a 30-minute service, we are very concerned about this. The route (and the 8) are purely commercial services so the council has no direct influence, but we are looking at ways to improve this. The Managing Director of First Bus said he is open to changes and we are pursuing this. At time of writing he is due to attend the neighbourhood combined Forum on 21 March.

Bristol North Baths — Work towards completing and selling the flats this year is continuing, with the new part of the development the current priority. We are told that the flats are still on course to be completed in mid-December and the library early next year. No news as yet around any new tenants for the old baths building.

Mayor's consultation on a new Corporate Plan

As already mentioned, a new corporate plan is out for consultation from the mayor, which closes on 5 January 2017 (www.bristol.gov.uk/corpstrategy).

Changes that could affect our neighbourhood include:

- Removal of devolved funding for local highway projects – raising concerns about how locally led schemes can be progressed;
- Alternative ways for delivering parks (maybe trusts or mutual):
- Savings to the budget for Neighbourhood Partnerships and a focus on priority neighbourhoods;
- Fewer council-run libraries maybe community run centres – we don't know what this may mean for the new site being built at Gloucester Rd;
- Possible urban parishes, which could raise their own budget precept, but be different from NPs:
- · Reduced funding for planning enforcement.

We are now in an era of severe cuts to services, so please do read the document and feed in your views. Feel free to copy us in on any submission you make.

Residents' Parking issues - At the recent Congested Streets Forum, a group of residents from both sides of Gloucester Rd near other RPS areas expressed frustration at commuters parking in their area. They have decided to survey streets to see how much call there is for an RPS covering areas like Elton Rd and North Rd. We are still trying to clarify the basis for review of our local areas or developing new schemes following the election and have heard from many residents who have views on the matter. The mayor stated that where residents and local councillors want a scheme and have the support of the Neighbourhood Partnership this should be possible. Please get in touch with Martin and Fi if you have views (either way) on residents' parking or would like to help with a survey.

The crossing at Zetland Rd/Gloucester Rd

 A new scheme called the Southmead Quietway is under development. This is a cycle route to Southmead Hospital designed to follow quiet roads and thus appeal to a wider group of prospective



cyclists, helping encourage active travel and cut car commuting, congestion, pollution and lack of physical exercise. It's basically improved signage, with little budget for new paths or facilities; however, it should involve remodelling the junction of Zetland Rd, Gloucester Rd and Elton Rd. It should also include a new cycle crossing at Coldharbour Rd. Many residents have been in touch about cycling issues, including the Make Space for Cycling initiative and improving the confusing and dangerous junction at Zetland Rd is a long standing local issue. We're therefore delighted this should at last get the priority it deserves and shall be following progress with it.

Air pollution — Local air quality and the breach of safe limits in our air due to traffic pollution is a long-standing issue of concern to residents and recent reports estimate that 300 people in Bristol die from poor air quality. Gloucester Rd is part of the air quality management area but is still polluted. We've been out asking local people what they think about air pollution, whether it affects their health, and solutions they would support to tackle this silent killer. Our party co-leader, Caroline Lucas MP visited Gloucester Rd In October to help find out what residents think. A motion was passed at Full Council recently with unanimous support for a clean air zone and Fi is on the Mayoral air quality group looking at ways to improve the situation in Bristol.

Bristol's big drink debate – Public health is asking Bristol residents to fill in a brief questionnaire about how much and why they drink alcohol to inform our alcohol strategy. Local History Matters Great Mill Furlong

BHA local history research – text by Denis Wright ©

A recent article in Bishopston Matters gave some examples of field-names found in the Horfield tithe survey (1841) and their connection with ways of living, dating back to the Middle Ages; fields such as 'Conygre' and the breeding of rabbits, and 'Allhays' and the hunting of deer. Charles Martin's Record Interpreter (1892) and similar compilations are helpful in tracing words connected with land use which were not simply obsolete but very nearly lost – words or word elements, for example, such as 'tron'. In October 1661, Horfield manor court ordered one of its tenants. George Attwood, to repair the hedge, ditch, and a stile (clymarem) between his field called 'Tronlease' and Nicholas Bennett's 'Tronlease'. According to Charles Martin, 'tron' was the word for a beam used for weighing standard 28 lb wool-sacks. In Horfield, the sheep were probably gathered on the common and herded down Gastons Lane for sorting, shearing and marking, for which the Tronlease boundaries (35a-b & 36) may well have been specially designed. A repeat presentment in 1674 saw the name of both fields changed to 'Golden Hill' but the court reverted to 'Tronlease' in the following year.

In 1890, the rector of Horfield, Fanshawe Bingham, claimed to have found the remains of a tumulus in a field lying between the Rectory and 'Golden Hills', numbered 72 on the tithe map

and 52 on the Ordnance Survey map of 1881. Details can be found in Chapter VI of Horfield Miscellanea. Other finds, dating from 1896, after the laying of gas pipes to Golden Hill, were the bones of 'a man of great stature' which Bingham reburied 'in old graves in the Church-yard'. He also seemed to find a sacred significance in the 'many flat stones' at the tumulus and especially 'a large trunk of a tree black with age lying East and West which we did not disturb'. O'Neil and Grinsell's work on Gloucestershire long barrows found the whole of Bingham's account 'unsatisfactory'

Bingham quoted both the tithe number and the OS number of the relevant field in the process of locating his tumulus but did not think it worthwhile to supply the field-name: Great Mill Furlong. The name

was long-established, appearing 200 years earlier in the sale of Episcopal land by Parliament in 1649 and appearing also in a list of customary rents in Horfield in 1541-42. The word 'Great' signifies only that this field was bigger than its neighbour 'Little Mill Furlong'. The word 'Furlong' does not here signify a measure of distance but 'plough-land' in general. The word 'Mill' seems to mean what it says. Arthur Sabin in his Manorial Accounts claimed that there was 'no reference at all to a mill of any sort' in medieval Horfield, but of course 'no reference' does not necessarily mean 'no mill'. There was certainly no water-mill on Great Mill Furlong because there was no watercourse big enough to power it. If there truly was a mill, it must have been a windmill. It certainly occupied a good location on the ridge leading to Durdham Down, from which Bingham says you could see St Mary-Redcliffe to the south and Pen-Pole and the Welsh Hills in the other direction. In view of Bingham's description of 'a tree black with age' the remains may well have been those of a ruined post mill.




