All the Gossip with GBBO's semifinalist Briony May

The Great **British Bake** Off is a much-loved tradition in our household. **Each Tuesday** evening over

the summer, we settled down with a cup of tea and appropriate delicious cake from Joe's Bakery and supported Briony May, as she so fantastically flew the flag for Bristol. Imagine our delight when we discovered the 2018 contestant was a Horfield resident!

Colleague Anne-Louise and myself were delighted Briony was able - in her whirlwind life of media and baking – to take some time out for coffee and chat on Gloucester Road with the Bishopston Matters

The locally born Briony May we meet is indeed the one we have grown to love over the series - warm. bubbly, smiley and enthusiastic. She is quick to point out that in fact all the contestants were just as you imagined - genuine and down to earth. A close group, many of them still WhatsApp each other

So how do you find yourself on one the UK's most popular TV programmes? Briony, who came late to baking, explained:

"It was while I was suffering from a long-term illness and had to take extended leave from my teaching job, and, not one to sit comfortably inactive, I

thought, I'm going to



try baking. The idea of making something that in the end people (myself included) could enjoy was very tempting. My first attempts definitely needed a bit of fine tuning," she laughs, "but it was when I did a cake in the shape of a penguin that I realised – hev I can do this!"

And with friends and family urging her to apply for the Great British Bake Off, one day very quietly with no fuss and without telling anyone, that is exactly what she did. In fact, it took several attempts from the GBBO team to make contact with her, as initially not recognising the number she assumed it was a PPI call and ignored them! She describes her experience as fantastic and reflects on how Noel Fielding (kind and naughty) and Sandy Toksvig were so genuinely sympathetic. Especially when off camera, while assembling her biscuit chandelier, the cameraman accidently swiped part of her creation off the table with his equipment - sending biscuits cracking and crumbling. That moment was frantic with the judges about to appear, she had to quickly make it presentable and is thankful to Manon, who immediately was on hand to help.

Her proudest moments on the show – the first being named Star Baker for her game pie 'a la Alice in Wonderland' style – you know, the one you could play croquet on! And secondly, picking herself up after some harsh criticism from Paul of her signature bake and channelling this emotion to win the technical challenge!

Briony is quick to point out that none of it would have been possible if it hadn't been for the unconditional support she had from her husband. mum and other local family and friends. Her inspirational, 93-year old Nan was present for the final and had a lovely time chatting with Noel

Fielding, who took a real shine to her.

So, what now? A new world of exciting opportunities is flooding in – potential books deals, personal appearances, baking demos - she even has an agent these days (which her mum is incredibly proud to share with everyone – including the plumber!). She continues to be very much involved with her community, including recently judging at her old primary school Elmlea, at their very own Bake Off. And of course, her local pubs The Gloucester Old Spot (who hosted GBBO Tuesdays with a big screen) and The Crafty Cow have been brilliant for her throughout.



And when she has some quiet time? She likes nothing better than taking a stroll with her hubby Steve, 3-year old daughter and adored Cockapoo Archie, in St Andrews Park, and tea and cakes at Cox and Baloney (they did some GBBO filming in

there too). And of course, she is also very fond of Joe's Bakery and Bakers and Co!


The award-winning Window Wanderland is back in 2019 and needs you!

The team is already planning this winter's Window Wanderland and volunteers are needed to help run the project, which will take place take place

Window Wanderland started in Bishopston back in 2015. Each year the arts trail has grown with more and more houses, shops and organisations getting involved. Themes over the years have included Minecraft, cats, dinosaurs, under the sea and outer space.

The project that started here has been so successful that

communities across the world have run their own Window Wanderlands, from tower block residents to whole villages, creating curiosities.

Lucy's inspirational work to bring communities together was recognised earlier this year by Bristol Life magazine and she won the coveted 'Creative' category in its annual awards ceremony.

"When I found out I was in a category with 'We the Curious', the 'Bottleyard' and a heap of PR and photographic agencies, well it seemed obvious they wouldn't pick little old me around my kitchen table," she said.

"It was a shock when they said I had won - but I couldn't have done it without Bishopston's creativity!"

There will be art workshops at the Ardagh, to help you create your displays, 6.00-8.30pm on the following Thursdays in January – 10, 17, 24, 31 and 6 Feb 2019.




On Saturday 1 December, 10am-1pm at the Cafe on the Common



Sailing Success for Sally!

On the phone, local Horfield resident and sailing champion Sally Rodrigues asks that when I arrive at Horfield Leisure Centre, "Please walk to me and greet me and introduce yourself, I'll have my dog Lillie". This is

because this champion I am meeting is blind.

It's not Sally's blindness though that defines her (she was born sighted and, due to a degenerative condition diagnosed at the age of 6, it wasn't until her late teens, she lost her full sight), it's the collection of gold, silver and bronze medals she has won in sailing across the globe, including World and Nationals – and there is her zeal for life – she exudes positivity.

Always an adrenaline junkie, and with a law degree and her own complementary therapy business -Rodrigues Relaxation, based at the Cameron Centre in Lockleaze - sailing came guite late to Sally.

Born in Hertfordshire, she moved to Bristol and soon adopted our neighbourhood as home. It was around 10 years ago being guite new in the area that she read an advert in the RNIB pamphlet – The East Anglian Sailing Trust were on the search for sailors to join them. Sally has always felt an affinity with water (she also swam for the National Squad in her teens) - and so began her affair with the sea. Her first boat she stepped foot on was a solid 29-foot wooden craft. She admits she wasn't very good to start with - but her enthusiasm and team spirit were there, and with tips like feeling the sun and wind on certain parts of her face helping her to find her direction, her skills soon honed in.



By 2010 she was training with the GB blind sailing squad where, with the wind in her hair, the speed

sensation and freedom, even sailing in snow conditions sent her head over heels in love for the sport. "I fondly remember I had a huge smile on my face the whole time I was at sea in the snow. The irony being that I could still have a huge smile on my face even though I couldn't feel it!"

Sally and Lillie regularly stroll to Horfield Leisure Centre – which is one of her sponsors and handily on the doorstep, for fitness training and swimming, during which time Lillie takes a break and is pampered in her basket with the Horfield team. Sally and the GB squad are also resident at the UK Sailing Academy in Cowes on the Isle of Wight: they train there as well as regular sessions on Lake Windermere, all keeping her and the team shipshape.

By March 2017 to her utter uncontained joy (you may have heard her scream from the top of Purdown!), she was selected to represent Great Britain at the World Fleet Blind Sailing Championships, in America - Lake Michigan. She described the opening ceremony for her and the GB crew, made up of 50/50 sighted and blind sailors, as hugely emotional, "the stuff dreams are made of". Their skill was well rewarded with 1 gold medal, 2 silvers and the Squadron Cup. Sally recently returned from the 2018 Blind Match Racing World Championships with a silver for GB!

So, what's next? Well definitely more sailing – she was off to Cowes for the weekend - but important to Sally is to now campaign for Blind Sailing to be recognised as a sport by the next Paralympics in 2020. It was a pleasure to meet with inspirational Sally at Horfield Leisure Centre and take a look at her most recent silver medal. It's a fun, friendly and informal session and we'll provide willow, foliage, advice and encouragement. You'll weave a willow ring, decorate it and walk away with something absolutely beautiful. We have indoor space and space undercover in case it's awful weather but wrap up warm as well. We also provide secateurs and gloves but bring your own if got some nice ones. Children welcome and hot drinks and mice pies available.

Also, we're starting our new expanded afterschool club on Thursday 8 January and at the time of writing we still have spots! It's for Years 1-6. 3:45-5:45, and we do a pick-up from Bishop Rd Primary but you can drop off your kids from other schools. Our sessions are a happy mix of free play, bush craft, tree climbing, den building, outside cooking, nature exploration, gardening, arts, singing and silliness, and all getting together and telling stories and toasting snacks on the fire. It's a small club with just

a warm indoor space but there's lots of wrapping up and running around and shouting in the dark. It's great! It is run by me (Lucy – I run the garden and the Golden Adventure holiday club) and Lisa (Forest School leader, bush craft whizz and fire starter extraordinaire) with help from Millie (a small and friendly dog). Get in touch to find out more.

And It may be December but we don't stop in the garden! We run our toddler groups, afterschool club and volunteer days all through the winter and it's a great time to get outdoors and spend time with other folks, which I always find important in the short dark days. 





Planning Portal relaunched...at historic moment for planning in **Bishopston**

The Bishopston Society is pleased to announce that our Planning Portal has now been relaunched.

This unique and innovative web service provides an interactive view of local planning applications

that we are scrutinising, and often making representations to Bristol City Council on, on behalf of You, the members of our Society and other Bishopstonians. Monitoring planning applications is, and has always been, a key facet of The Bishopston Society's work.

The Planning Portal enhances The Bishopston Society's planning work by providing a visual representation of selected current planning applications via an interactive map, and access to a database customised for Bishopston.

Please take a look - the Planning Portal can be





accessed via pp.bishopstonsociety. org.uk. More information about planning in Bishopston can be found at bishopstonsociety.org.uk/planning.

Historic moment – The portal relaunch takes place by coincidence at the same time as a historically significant planning application went live. As many readers will have already seen, fresh plans for the Bristol North Baths have just been revealed. (See our website for further reports on this).

Bristol City Council have put the North Baths up for sale and the preferred bidder is proposing to convert the building into offices. At time of writing, we are preparing to attend the Old Bristol North Baths Consultation Day on 20 November detailing these plans.

While it is extremely regrettable that the Bishopston Medical practice withdrew from the project, as a result of the endless delays and certain aspects of the building as constructed which were not suitable for their requirements, it is good to see that it will now be brought back into use, albeit not as a health centre.

It is proposed the upper floor will be a single open-plan office area for one company, while the ground floor will comprise small offices on shortterm lets to young start-up companies around the perimeter, with the internal spaces proposed for private use as a coffee bar and gym for the staff.

The council specifically excluded the requirement for the Baths to provide community facilities, on the basis that the Bishopston Library provides this function within the overall project. However, it would be good to see some flexibility for community uses within the coffee bar area of the Baths once it is up and running.

The alterations currently in for planning permission are almost totally internal and will not have any impact on the Grade 2 listed building. Please go to our Planning Portal to see all the planning application details and the related details concerning listed building consent.

Tax on dividends

The rules for taxing dividends changed dramatically in 2016, when the notional tax credit of 10% was removed and new rates of tax on dividends were introduced. Under the new regime, there is a dividend allowance which effectively works like a tax-free band for dividends (£5,000 in the 2017-18 tax year, then £2,000 from 6 April 2018).

Under the old rules, dividends could be taken tax-free within the basic rate band. However, the removal of the 10% tax credit has meant that tax will now be paid on all dividends above the personal allowance and the dividend allowance.

Small business owners running limited companies tend to pay themselves a mixture of a small salary and the remainder in dividends. Many business owners will therefore be hit with tax liabilities; something they may not have been expecting.

Tax Assist Accountants can give you estimates of your tax payments; allowing you time to put some money aside each month. They'll also make sure that the company is deducting all the expenses it is entitled to and that you are claiming all the allowances you are eligible for.

Do I need to declare my property income to HMRC?

When you start renting out property, you must tell HMRC and you may have to pay tax. If you don't, you could be charged a penalty. You must report income from property rental if you receive:

- £2,500 or more from property after deducting allowable expenses
- £10,000 or more from property before deducting allowable expenses

If your property income does not meet either of these thresholds, you must still call HMRC to advise them of your new income.

If you make a loss on renting, you're unlikely to meet these thresholds. But as accountants we often recommend that you seek confirmation from HMRC that it doesn't require a tax return from you. Furthermore, you may want to register for a tax return voluntarily if you have losses you'd like to document and carry forward.

Trojan Dogs

The Trojan Horse was used by the Greeks to enter the city of Troy and win the war. The horse had a hidden load of men inside who, once

inside the city of Troy, were able to creep out of the horse and open the city gates to allow in the Greek army, who destroyed the city.

We now have a similar new concept, the 'Trojan dog'. A Troian dog is a dog with an unknown health history that has been brought into the UK for rehoming. These dogs are of particular concern as they are very likely carrying infections that are common abroad but which we are free of in the UK. Recently the number of rescued dogs entering the UK has increased quite dramatically, hence risk of diseases entering UK by this route has also increased.

These dogs are being imported legally by wellmeaning rescue societies under the Pet Passport scheme. However, the scheme was set up to protect human, not animal, health. Currently the scheme only covers health requirements regarding rabies and the tapeworm Echinococcus Multilocularis, both of which are zoonotic diseases potentially infecting humans as well as animals.

There is no requirement for imported dogs to have health screening prior to travel or even to have the standard vaccinations that we recommend annually for our own pet dogs here. As a result, we are seeing an increase in 'exotic' diseases in UK as travelled dogs may be harbouring disease. This can have serious implications for the imported dog itself as well as for the wider dog population in UK.

In an ideal world, a client thinking of rehoming a pet from abroad would first talk to his/her vet to discuss the implications. Ideally the dog would be screened for disease before travel; depending on the origin of the dog this may include diseases such as ehrilichia, babesia, leishmania, Dirofilaria immitis, Brucella canis and hepatozoon.

Ideally the dog should be treated for ticks as well as vaccinated with a standard vaccine before travel. Recently we have seen cases of Distemper in rescued dogs from abroad.

These measures are responsible for the pet travelling (as stressing an already infected dog could potentially worsen any illness), as well as responsible towards the rest of the UK dog population.

In addition, many of these rescue dogs will have been strays in their country of origin so it is also possible that putting them into a home situation



will cause stress and result in undesirable behaviour.

Currently the British Veterinary Association and the Dogs Trust are lobbying parliament to tighten the pet travel rules once the UK leaves the EU next year. That will go a long way to helping reduce the Trojan dog risk. Meanwhile a plea to all who may be thinking of rehoming a rescue dog from abroad to consider the health risks and if you are determined then please ask for the screening tests, vaccinations and tick treatment to be performed before the dog starts on its journey to UK.

Redesigning Your Garden

Jobs to do now - As the days get shorter and the nights draw in, it's time to think about putting the garden to bed for the winter. Clean garden tools and the barbeque and store them away in a shed if you have one; treat outdoor furniture with protective oils, store only perfect, unblemished veg from your vegetable patch anything damaged won't keep. Local History Matters

Cholera at Horfield Barracks

BHA local history research – text copyright Andy Buchan.

In the 19th century a terrifying new disease struck Britain, Cholera – it was spread through the drinking of contaminated water and caused a series of major epidemics throughout the country. It mainly affected those living in slums and poor housing because of high population density, poor sanitary conditions and usually contaminated water supplies.

The disease was first recorded in the autumn of 1831 on the North East coast of England, having gradually spread across the whole of Europe. In July 1832 a women and child were found in a house in Bristol suffering from the disease. By the time the outbreak was declared to be over in November 1832, at least 1612 are recorded to have been infected of whom 626, 38%, had died. In some places – for example the Bristol Workhouse, St Peter's Hospital – the death rate was even higher. These figures are considered to be underestimates since deaths were not formally recorded before 1837. A further outbreak occurred in 1848-49, which had an even higher death rate and another with a lower death toll in 1854–55. A final outbreak occurred in 1866.

was one of the reasons that the subsequently re-laid out. On 12 October 1854 the disease was seen in Horfield Barracks, two miles from the city where there was an outbreak and about one mile from the village of Westbury on

Trym, which had also been badly affected. The following day William Budd, the well-known Bristol physician and epidemiologist, who had been involved in investigating the 1848-49 outbreak, was called to the barracks. When he arrived, he discovered that there were between 500 and 600 men in the barracks and five privies. These were reported to be in a very poor unsanitary condition because the drought of that year meant that the water pumps in the barracks had stopped working and water had to be brought to the barracks from some distance away. At that time four men were diagnosed with the disease.


Budd immediately put in measures to control the outbreak and reduce the risk of further spread of the



disease. These included disinfecting all the toilets twice each day. Toilets/buckets used by sick men contained disinfectant. All men were checked twice each day for signs of the disease and men from the barracks were prevented from visiting the city or neighbouring towns. Within a short time, the outbreak was controlled. In total between eight and ten men had caught the disease and through prompt treatment all recovered.

Later that year Budd was able to successfully apply the same programme at the Bristol Workhouse. In 1849 there had been 600 cases of infection and about 150 deaths. In 1854 there were three outbreaks in the workhouse: 30 cases of infection were seen and there were eight deaths. Budd said that if his measures had been followed with more rigour there would probably have been even fewer deaths.



News from Friends of Bishopston Library

Bishopston library was delighted and privileged to host the last ever Bristol performance of Stony Broke in No Man's Land by the Hotwells Howlers (pictured right). First commissioned by the Friends of Bristol Museum to mark the centenary of the outbreak of World War I, this show is based on a range of sources, including original research, about the wartime experiences of people from Bristol and Somerset.

Through songs – traditional and less well known – words and images, it tells the story of those who fought, those who died, some who deserted and others who were conscientious

objectors. Playing to a full house, Stony Broke was an emotional roller-coaster, harrowing, funny and compassionate, and was certainly really appreciated by the audience. The evening raised £89 for the Red Cross, the Hotwells Howlers chosen charity.



The library also had a display of WW1 stories and photos contributed by local people. In a similar vein to the show, the display looked at all aspects of wartime experience. The sheer scale of the First World War make it hard to comprehend - both the show and the display reminded us that it is perhaps only through the individual stories of men and women that we can begin to understand its lasting and devastating impact.

We don't have any definite news yet on the next phase of the library strategy. However, we understand that the next phase will involve a smaller number of meetings covering multiple areas, and will enable people to attend either during the day or in the evening. These meetings are likely to take place in the new year, and we hope to be able to let you have the dates in December - look out for information on our Facebook page and we will send via email to supporters.



We don't have any events during December, but look out for information about writing sessions early in 2019 with local author Mike Manson. And if you have written a letter to Santa, you can post it in the library letter-box.

News from our Bishopston & Redland Councillors

Bishopston ward news

Bristol Energy - Did you know that Bristol City Council has founded an energy company, committed to being a force for social good? Bristol Energy is a gas and electricity supplier, for both domestic and business customers, that champions social equality. It's one of the only publicly owned energy companies in the country, and they offer fair and transparent tariffs (including renewables-only options), re-invest in local communities, and support and invest in renewables.

Around 7% of residents in our ward are already Bristol Energy customers – why not find out more here: www.bristol-energy.co.uk or pop into The Hub on the Harbourside.

Budget consultation – Every February, the council sets a budget for the next year, which sets out how much money will be spent on each of the services the council provides. Since 2010, government has drastically cut the amount of money the council receives. At the same time, its costs have risen, because of inflation and because more people need to use the council's services. In recent years, the council has had to cut budgets to make ends meet. This year, however, that may not have to be the case, but only if council tax is increased by 3%. The council is consulting on residents' opinions about this - you can take part here: bristol.gov.uk/ budget2019-2020.

Bus changes - First Bus has made changes to bus services in our area, which we believe will be to the detriment of local residents. The number 70 will no longer serve Temple Meads (apart from late evenings), and the numbers 9 and 71 will no longer operate on Sundays or evenings.

As the buses in Bristol are privately run, the council has no control over the changes, but that doesn't



mean you can't make your voice heard. The more people that tell First what a terrible idea these changes are, the more likely they are to reconsider. You can contact them using their form here: bit. lv/2JJdL2M

HMO consultation – Earlier in the year, the council consulted on introducing additional licensing of Houses in Multiple Occupation (HMOs) in the 12 central wards of Bristol, including our ward. This consultation included a proposed fee structure. Since then, a high court judgement been made that is requiring the council to re-consult on the fee structure. Have your say here: bristol.citizenspace. com/communities/further-consultation-licence-hmos.

Filton Bank works - Residents who have travelled by train recently will no doubt be aware that there are a lot of engineering works going on. A key part of this has been on the Filton Bank, which runs between Temple Meads and Parkway stations, including past Ashley Down. Network Rail has been doubling the number of tracks, which will allow for more reliable and frequent services, both locally and inter-city. The works will also allow the future re-opening of Ashley Down station, which is planned for 2021. You can find out more about the works here: networkrail.co.uk/bristol-upgrades.

Gloucester Road Christmas - Some great events will be going on along Gloucester Road this Christmas - come along and help support our local independent high street! Gloucester Road Central (the top of Pigsty Hill) are having their **Christmas** Street Party on 6 December, 5-8pm, and the southern part of the road are having a Festive Bonanza on 2 December, 9am-7:30pm.

Redland ward news

Sale of the Bristol North Baths building

- Redevelopment of the old Bristol North Baths building is now at the stage of a new planning application. The buyer wants to discuss their plans locally, and invited us to discuss their adaptation



of the half-converted building into offices for their company and other local office users. We are hoping there is scope to support community organisations in some way once the company confirms their move will take place. Any profits from sale will be ring-fenced for affordable housing across the city.

Libraries 'engagement' - While Fi and Martin are pleased that the council has withdrawn its proposed library closures for the moment, we are still pushing for a clear longer-term commitment to libraries. This, alongside a well worked strategy, is needed so that libraries and the groups that support them have the security they need to plan for the future. The council has proposed a process to 'engage' communities on ideas for the future. These discussions are meant to link issues around the future of community buildings and branch libraries and in this area community activities have to share the one council-run space.

We don't know what background information is being provided, but we stressed that earlier ideas and responses from 2015 and 2017 consultations should be included if the council wants a practical discussion. We're worried about consultation fatigue!

The form of outreach is not clear as initially it was proposed only daytime meetings would be held in most areas, plus a chance to comment online or via paper copies at libraries. We're pressing for more evening meetings. It's likely that some funds for piloting ideas such as community management of buildings or co-locating facilities and activities could be available from underspent library budget. Do watch this space.

Parking – There have also been further incidents of emergency vehicles being trapped on the way to callouts by bad parking, and collisions in congested streets. While the administration has promised officer support to look at potential solutions, this has yet to materialise so Fi and Martin are pressing for some action on this. Matters are further complicated by the resignation of the cabinet member for Transport and her replacement by the Mayor. which may well indicate a delay while information is handed over. In the meantime, we are conducting some door-to-door surveys in some of the affected areas. If you think your road is being affected by poor parking then please let us know and we will come and talk to residents in your street.

Bristol waste - Recently entire streets have had their recycling collections missed, with some waiting for several days before it's been picked up. Over 80 streets were missed one Friday. Clearly this is more than a glitch, so please let us know if this happens to you so that we get a clearer picture of the situation. Please do report missed collections via the council website so the extent of the problem can be logged and to remind the council to provide the service.

Fly tipping and lack of enforcement -

Several people have contacted us about the lack of enforcement from the council over fly tipping, even where residents have clearly identified the offender. We're pushing for increased resource on this, as once again, we feel that residents are doing everything they can but aren't getting the right support from the council, which is disheartening. We have, however been told that the new 'litter police' have been active on Gloucester Road so we are trying to get some feedback on how they have been doing in our area.

Tackling disposable plastics - Martin's petition calling on the council to eliminate single-use disposable plastics from its activities topped 3.500 signatures precipitating a debate at Full Council in November and at the time of writing we look forward to seeing the Mayor's response to the issues raised. Fi had started work as Cabinet Member to get rid of such plastics in council-owned premises such as parks and museums, but this has been stalled for the last year. We're therefore hoping that the 4.000 plus signatures petition from people across the city will be accepted by the administration and kick-start action by the council to play its part in reducing waste.
