

News from the Goldenhill **Community Garden**

Hi everyone

June is always a great month in the garden. All risk of frosts is long gone, and with our Big Spring Fair and plant sale done and dusted, we planted out all of our frost-tender veg and flowers in the second half of May. Now our sweetcorn and celeriac, pumpkins, courgettes and squashes join the rest of the veg busy getting their roots down and drinking up any rain and all the sun. If you haven't planted anything yet don't worry it's not too late! Lots of things can go in now for example, tomato or chilli seedlings, and there's even still time to start off loads of other vegetables from seed. So, if all your courgettes or cabbages or carrots have been munched by slugs - try, try again! If you're new to gardening and you've managed to nurture your seeds into seedlings and you've managed to keep them watered and kept off the slugs and aphids - well done! And if you haven't then don't worry and don't be disheartened - gardening is great but also can be tricky and unpredictable!

I got into growing in 2003; I had no idea what I was doing, everything got munched and that year I only managed to successfully grow potatoes! But such delicious potatoes! - glorious buried treasure, and I still feel that same sense of achievement 20 years later! That's why I love growing things so much and even if you haven't got a garden (I haven't got one at home!) then growing in pots still hits the spot. And it's another reason I love the community garden so much - it is such a treat to get access to this lovely big growing space and ponds, trees, flower beds and fruit bushes but getting to share all the work with a lovely load of people! We're open every Wednesday 10am-4pm and we show new folks around at 12 and 2.30pm. There's always a range of jobs and no experience or tools needed and no need to come every week or stay all day. Each week you can even take home some of the delicious harvest.





This year we are going to be carrying on growing for us, but also growing veggies to donate to Family Food Action up at the Ardagh. They work in partnership with community organisations supporting families in Bristol to access good food. They accept donations on Tuesdays 10.30am - 12.30pm; fresh veg and fruit is always welcome. The community garden sits at the bottom of the allotment slope with over 200 plots so a huge amount of food is grown here. Last year we put up a sign to say we'd collect any spare veg and deliver it up there and the response was great. David, who volunteered to take it, was often pushing away a wheelbarrow piled high!

Last month we also found out that Quartet are funding our Family Adventure Days for children with SEN and their families. So please check our website or Facebook page with info on dates and how to book and come along for baking, digging, pond dipping, exploring nature, climbing, harvesting and munching pizza. There's no set age so, if you think that sounds like a good fit for your family, get in touch and I'll let you know when booking opens.

Horfield Organic Community Orchard – 25 years and growing

The Get Growing Garden Trail – a showcase for Bristol's inspiring community food growing projects - takes place over the first weekend in June. The city-wide event is a brilliant opportunity to visit thirty different growing spaces. One of the these, the pioneering Horfield Organic Community Orchard (HOCO), was set up on some former allotment plots in 1998. This year it celebrates its 25th anniversary as an orchard project, growing fruit, community, wellbeing and learning.

"It's hard to believe HOCO is 25 years old," orchard member Shannon Smith, told us. "It thrives thanks to all those years of voluntary activity and public support. Planting fruit trees is relatively easy. Looking after them as they grow up, and age, asks more of us. We are delighted to be celebrating HOCO as a successful project, although less-thanperfect, with the potential to keep on growing for another 25 years, or more."

As an established organic orchard, HOCO is home to microorganisms, fungi, insects, plants, birds and animals, as well as many varieties of apples, pears and plums. Bring your fruit growing questions to the Open Day. Orchard members will be at hand to advise and share nature-friendly solutions. You are invited to take a closer look at experimental projects, in the Home Orchard Plot area.

Shannon added, "We know the growing conditions of high summer affect the quality and quantity of fruit - in any year and in the following one. We are also concerned about the impacts of climate emergency chaos, and how to prepare and adapt for an unpredictable future We are keen to show and share actions that can help sustain future harvests."



Home-made cakes and refreshing cordials, as well as plants and produce, will be on sale. Find out more about pruning courses and how to join the orchard as a supporting Friend.







This idea proved so popular that the space rapidly expanded to offer a huge variety of paintings, prints, jewellery, lampshades, ceramics, gifts, cards and more, all by local Bristol

artists and creatives.

Sarah soon became an active member of the community, helping to enliven her section of Gloucester Road, known as Glos Rd Central, putting on Mayfest, the Christmas Street Party, the Gloucester Road Art Banners and various fundraising events. She loves being one of the long-time traders on her favourite high street of independent shops!

Many of the first artists to join still sell their work at Room 212 and have become good friends. For instance. Rosie Webb brought her popular paintings of quirky animals directly to Room 212 the day it opened. Katie Johnston's beautiful enamel jewellery has evolved over the years but is still a firm favourite, and Hannah Turner's ceramics are best sellers even though they are now made by a women's cooperative in Sri Lanka. Toni Burrows' fascinating mosaics and Jenny Urguhart's beautiful paintings of Bristol always look wonderful in the windows. Many of the artists are still North Bristol Artists and have exhibited on the Art Trail with Sarah in her studio downstairs and in the Eco House in the garden round the back.



Use your savings as a force for good

If you're seeking to be more environmentally friendly, it's worth considering the impact your savings can have. One positive and impactful option is to invest in renewable, communityowned energy.

With the launch of their new share offer. Bristol Energy Cooperative aims to bring people together to tackle the climate emergency and the energy crisis. The not-for-profit is seeking to raise £1million to develop more green, clean energy projects across the region, at speed.

When you invest in the energy cooperative, your money will:

- Tackle climate change by funding the delivery of pioneering clean energy projects such as rooftop solar panels on community buildinas
- Support local community with cheaper energy bills for host buildings, and raising community benefit funds for local initiatives
- Democratise energy ownership, allowing communities and individuals to feel the benefit of renewable energy generation
- Earn a potential financial return, with a projected 5% in this share offer

BEC's business model of raising funds has proved very successful so far. Since it was set up in 2011, the co-op has raised over £15 million, and developed over 10MWp of solar and battery assets, enough to power roughly 3,250 homes. The organisation is an important contributor of renewable energy in the South West, generating roughly the equivalent of 30% of Bristol's solar energy.



It's not only BEC's members that gain from a return on investment. Over the past 10 years, the cooperative has channelled over £350,000 of community benefit payments into local sustainability initiatives, such as community gardens, education and biodiversity programmes. Also, community spaces such as Easton Community Centre and Knowle West Media Centre have benefitted from cheaper energy rates thanks to the solar installations by BEC, meaning they have more funds to spend on their vital services. In December 2022 BEC completed a 1MW rooftop PV install at the second Bottleyard Film studios (TBY2). This is by far its largest rooftop scheme to date, and BEC believes it's the largest community rooftop solar array in the UK.



Property planning is a must for the upcoming legislation in the PRS



- 1. EPCs (energy performance certificates) - There are proposals that by 2025 all rented properties are going to need a band C in order to be rented out. This is guite a iump from the current minimum band of E and we are currently working on all of our managed properties to increase them ahead of time; for some properties this can be as simple as adding TRVs or thermostats, however some properties are needing further insulation in the flooring and loft spaces. We suggest that all landlords look at this early as it is likely going to be one of the bigger costs faced for some of the period properties in Bristol.
- Renter's reform bill This is probably the biggest change coming to the lettings industry since ASTs were introduced 30 years ago. The proposals within the bill include an introduction of standard periodic tenancies, abolishing section 21s and doubling notice periods for rental increases. In principle the idea of periodic tenancies is great, as we always want good tenants to stay as long as possible in a property; however, from a planning perspective it puts the landlord at a disadvantage, as there would be a risk that the property becomes vacate over December / January which fixed terms are used to cover this period. The main obstacle would be student lettings as the lets are normally lined up 6 months in advance. Under the new proposals this would mean student lets would be turned around with 2 months' notice.

The abolishment of section 21 would just restrict the landlord's ability to regain possession of their property; however, as industry professionals we

have only issued these notices when, for example a landlord is looking to move back into their property, or when they are looking to sell. The other times would be if a tenant is not looking after the property. There would still be easier routes for the landlord to take under the new rules if there were breaches of tenancy (such as rental arrears and or antisocial behaviour). Our thoughts on this would be extending the notice period which was done during COVID rules, and this worked well as it gave the tenants plenty of time to plan accordingly.

Extending notice periods for increasing rentals is good for tenants to plan accordingly and make an informed decision without having the increased pressure of limited time at the property, and would not affect a landlord who is on top of their property planning.

Inheritance tax – strategies for your family

Inheritance tax (IHT) is a tax imposed on the estate of a deceased person, which can significantly reduce the amount of assets passed down to their loved ones. However, with proper estate planning, it is possible to reduce or even avoid paying IHT altogether. In this article, we will explore some of the strategies that can be used to mitigate the impact of IHT on your estate.

Nil Rate Band (NRB): The standard IHT rate in the UK is 40%, and it applies to the portion of the estate exceeding the threshold. The Nil Rate Band is the threshold up to which an estate is exempt from IHT. As of the current tax year (2023/2024), the NRB stands at £325,000 per person. Married couples and civil partners can effectively double their NRB allowance, as any unused portion of the first spouse or civil partner's NRB can be transferred to the surviving spouse or civil partner.

Residence Nil Rate Band (RNRB): The RNRB mitigates the impact of IHT on the main residence and is currently set at £175,000 per person. It only applies to estates where a residence is passed on to direct descendants and can also be transferred between spouses or civil partners.

Annual Exemptions: Every year, individuals can gift up to £3,000 tax-free, and this gift can be carried over for one year. This means that a couple can gift up to £6,000 without incurring any IHT. Gifts made to charities, political parties, and certain other organisations are also exempt.

Small Gifts Exemptions: In addition to the annual exemption, individuals can also make small gifts of up to £250 per recipient, free of IHT.

Lifetime Gifts: If a gift is made at least seven years before the donor's death, it will not be included in their estate for IHT purposes. However, if the donor passes away within seven years of making the gift, at least part of the value of the gift will be included in their estate.

Remember, you must record all gifts given to ensure it is clear they should be considered exempt.

Trusts: By placing assets into a trust, they are no longer considered part of the estate for IHT purposes. However, there may be other tax implications associated with trusts, so it is essential to seek professional advice before using this strategy.

Business Relief (BR): Investments that qualify for BR can be passed on free from IHT upon the death of



the investor, provided the shares have been owned for at least two years at that time. This is a wellestablished relief dating back 40 years, however, you should keep in mind that the value of an investment may go down as well as up and investors may not get back what they originally put in.

Inheritance tax can be a significant burden on an estate and is often stressful for the people dealing with paying the tax bill, which is often due before probate has been completed. Having a plan in place to mitigate this or for how the bill may be paid will be so helpful to your loved ones at an already difficult

Pollution from Pet Parasiticides

A recent publication (March 2023) from the Grantham Institute at Imperial College London has made sobering reading. It appears that we are now seeing an environmental impact from the use of parasiticides from small animal veterinary practice as well as across the counter preparations from pet shops and supermarkets. The study has collated evidence from waterways across England showing hot spots of pollution from pet parasiticides, even in urban areas. Parasiticides include products to protect against or treat fleas, ticks and worms.

Parasiticides are designed to be toxic – that is why they work in our pets - however, the toxicity does not stop there, it continues once in the environment. Currently there is minimal environmental risk assessment of products used in dogs and cats. This is unlike agricultural products which have strict regulation. One chemical, imidacloprid, was fully banned in UK in 2018 as an agricultural product due to environmental contamination and particularly toxic effects on aquatic life in our waterways. However, no such ban exists on its use in dogs and cats where thousands of kg are sold each year for the pet market.

Veterinary parasiticides have now been suggested as the potential primary source of contamination of our waterways by these chemicals. Not all products used are monitored by the Environment Agency, particularly the more recent compounds so the full picture is not known. However, we do know that even these small individual doses used are now applied so frequently and on an increasing population of pets that the total volumes used are considerable.

So how can we in veterinary practice help this issue and explain the consequences of using these products to our clients? First, we should be dispensing parasiticides responsibly using a riskassessed individual basis.

We need to educate owners to help prevent further contamination of our environment, particularly our waterways. This includes not letting your dog swim and do not bath him if he has product applied; pick up all dog and cat poo as often as possible and dispose of it in dog bins for incineration. Dispose of packaging responsibly; ideally return your packaging to the veterinary practice for safe disposal as well as returning any unused products. Consider using oral products rather than collar or spot on formulations.

We still need to protect our pets from parasites as well as protecting ourselves. We do still need to use anti-parasitic products but this can be balanced with a more sensitive environmental approach. Perhaps it is time to reconsider the treatment of entire populations of healthy animals and instead use targeted reactive treatments when necessary.

I may not have much influence

over worldwide environmental concerns but by making this issue more widely known I can at





Circles in Garden Design

The use of circles and curves in garden design create a strong statement, and give significant visual interest by adding structural lines, allowing the eye to follow around the garden, connecting with other forms. They can be used to fit unusual or difficult areas, with the possibilities being endless. At Secret Garden we enjoy creating garden designs that use a variety of shapes and forms, with simple circles and curves always being a winner.

When utilising curves, bold, sweeping arcs work better than too many wiggling lines. Curves work well in large spaces, and within smaller gardens the use of semi circles can trick the eye into thinking that the space is larger than it is.

Horseshoe and semi circles can be used effectively in seating areas to create a community feel, where people can sit together, converse and see each other easily. You could use a perspective cheat with circles to make your garden look longer than it is. Have the largest circle nearest to your window, with an overlapping smaller circle furthest away. This is a great trick to use in smaller urban gardens, and creates a good vantage point.

Circular paving looks smart, and is great for creating separate, differing sized patio areas within a garden. This can be useful for capturing early morning, afternoon or early evening sun, which hits in different parts of the garden.



Sharp angles in the garden can sometimes appear awkward and can also create tiny, unusable spaces in borders and beds, and in lawns can create tight spots that are difficult to mow. Circles and curves on the other hand work easily, and can be used around specimen trees, which can be used to create a focal point.

Ponds, instead of being edged with right angles, could be circular, oval or any kind of loose, flowing shape. This will complement circular lawns, patios and other areas of the garden. If there's one thing you should try to include in vour garden: it's water. It is so beneficial and will bring the buzz and song of nature into your life.





Concorde Way and Station Rd - While work on Ashley Down station carries on at a pace, we are upset to hear of the disruption the work has been causing at antisocial hours. We have been in touch with the neighbourhood engagement team, as well as the project managers to discuss these issues. There will be another public engagement session coming up soon where you can voice your opinion. We would like assurances that efforts are being made to keep the disruption of noisy trucks and work to a minimum.

Emma has now passed on all complaints about the closure of Concorde Way to the mayor, who has said that no changes can be made. We want to continue to challenge this assertion, especially as the current route is dangerous for cyclists and pedestrians. We fully intend to challenge this and call for more options for cyclists who use this route to commute.

Muller Road - A lot of people have been in touch regarding Muller Road and when it will be reopened. We have been assured that the works will be completed in July at the latest, and that delays have been primarily down to weather. Emma has been working with officers to look at ways to stop cars driving on the green at the bottom of Springfield, and has also raised concerns about the overgrown hedges on the pavement opposite.

Cricket Ground News - Emma recently attended the community engagement meeting at Gloucester Cricket Ground, where she was delighted to discuss issues with local residents regarding the ground. There was discussion about potential changes to the FLUMP and residents were able to ask questions about their concerns regarding the flood lights. Emma also discussed future solutions to transport regarding the cricket ground, and whether or not a shuttle bus might be an option in the future. While nothing is confirmed yet, watch this space!

Green light for The Ardagh – We are both delighted to hear the news that the Council have decided to transfer the lease of the bowling club to The Ardagh Community Trust (ACT). This move means that The Ardagh is now eligible to apply for major funding to help grow and develop the site. We, along with previous Green councillors, have been supporting The Ardagh in getting this change.

The decision is the conclusion of a lengthy consultation and decision-making process by the council, which resolved a number of the complex. licensing issues connected with areas of the site previously outside of ACT's lease. Lack of clarity about the ongoing maintenance and management of those areas was preventing the charity from being able to progress with much-needed

improvements to the site.

ACT has ambitious plans - informed by hundreds of local people over the last five years, which include a Changing Places facility, improved courts for multisport and events use, improved access and egress and ongoing improvements to the public gardens and play facilities. This change does not mean the bowling club will have to close, and can still operate for members under the new lease. We are delighted that a solution has been found that can suit everyone.

Redland ward

Redevelopment of former NEG site on Berkelev Rd rejected - Residents have been concerned about the proposed redevelopment of the site at 102 Gloucester Rd and the application was 'called in' by Martin so the planning decision would be made in public by a planning committee. This allows statements to be tabled and made in public forum by residents so they will be taken into account during the discussion. Two residents and Martin spoke at committee about various concerns about overdevelopment, parking, overlooking of the library flats, protection of street trees - including the one sponsored by residents - and the need to avoiding lengthy closure of the pavement during construction.

Committee members were very concerned about space standards and overall density of a seventeenflat development, road safety regarding the access for the filling station opposite, and overlooking. They compared it to the current permission gained quite recently for nine flats with retail and office and included. After a lengthy discussion the committee would not approve the proposal despite a recommendation from officers to accept the plan. They rejected it despite advice from officers that the concerns had to be balanced around the various government policies and none merited full rejection. There will now be a follow-up report to the next committee meeting which may or may not then be advised to approve it.

New smoke controls to be introduced - We've had notice that in the near future new smoke control regulation enforcement will be introduced in the city. Using new powers it is likely that the council will begin to clamp down on unauthorised solid fuels and the use of non-approved appliances (e.g. stoves or open fires). We recognise growing evidence of the harm small smoke particulates are causing to public health and if there's action the council can take to

reduce damaging smoke this could help those with breathing difficulties.

Lack of funds for Area projects – Most years we remind community groups about the lead-in process to the allocation of developer funds to local projects. This is the percentage of the sum eligible developments pay called Community Infrastructure Levy or CIL which comes to our local Area. The rest is held centrally by the mayor. We usually invite project ideas. Sadly, we have had news that due to optimism and overallocation last autumn and the slowing of developments in the city we have no confirmed funds in the pipeline at present! Until more development projects get underway and make their CIL payments there won't be even the modest budget we usually have for councillors in our part of the city to allocate. As councillors we have no other discretionary funds at our disposal at present so we're sorry to say this means no money for new road safety, play or other community building projects.

U-turns on promised inquiry into SEND 'spying'

- The mayor promised to hold an independent inquiry into the scandal of SEND officers 'spying' on parents of children with special educational needs and disabilities. However, he recently stated he is no longer planning to commission the investigation. We know this will disappoint many people who expected the inquiry.

We share this concern that the mayor appears to be abandoning the commitment, which was supported by all parties at Full Council. We believe the saga seriously damaged the council's reputation and its relationship with parents and quardians of SEND children. We need an impartial investigation so that lessons can be learned. Greens will work with other parties to do everything within our power to ensure there is an investigation.

Footway maintenance - Most of the ward's pavements are being treated over the next few months in a preventative maintenance programme where the surface is sealed with a non-slip coating This preserves the footway life though it doesn't deal with major faults. Only one side of each road will be treated at one time and it should take just a day to set in good weather so hopefully this will not be too big an inconvenience. All the stop taps and edges should be taped to protect services, driveways etc.

Where the footway is badly damaged it may need more attention so please do report it via the 'Report a pothole, damaged road or footpath' page of the council website. We're aware of concerns that some debris may not have been swept before the treatment and have reported this. The way loose debris is being blown off the footway could also affect parked cars so do consider moving yours. Let us know if you have any issues.

Trade bins on Gloucester Road tidied - Residents have been in touch with us about the ongoing problem of commercial bins crowding the pavement areas of Gloucester Road. We know that timed collections have been trialled in the city centre and may get rolled out into our area but in the meantime, we've asked enforcement officers to focus on the area more. Whilst some shops have no option other than to store their waste outside their premises, we are trying to ensure that this is kept to an absolute minimum as too many commercial bins are not only unsightly but can clog the footway up for wheelchair users and prams. With very few officers on the ground however, it's a long and slow business! We're keeping an eye on unlocked and overflowing trade bins that haven't been dealt with vet.

Pothole problems - The impact of winter and reduced road maintenance is sadly visible across the city. We're worried about how this affects road safety, and the condition of streets like Cheltenham Road is dire, as only the largest potholes are being fixed Martin raised this at a recent meeting of the Cabinet who approved extra government funds for road maintenance. Do remember to report any damaged roads and pavements via the council website. The Residents' section has a page for reporting all types of street issues, from potholes to blocked drains and abandoned vehicles. It's always helpful to get problems lodged in the maintenance and inspection system as soon as possible. Until a pothole has white lines painted around it, it may not be due for repair.

Reduced opening at household recycling centres

- We're sorry to report that, following service changes, the household reuse and recycling centres won't now be open 7 days a week. Please check before making a trip to see which one will be open each will offer a different 5 days a week service and you should still book online to reserve an entry slot at bristolwastecompany.co.uk. There are also now charges for disposal of DIY waste.
