


As we welcome autumn, The Ardagh site is as busy as ever! It's wonderful to see so many people of all ages enjoying this precious community resource every day. With continued support from so many generous volunteers we can grow and develop the opportunities available for all locally.

Play sessions on Horfield Common - Play provision is high on our agenda to build more community links and provide opportunities for children locally to access games, art, crafts, music, nature, dance and sport. ACT hosts Rock Out Baby on Tuesday mornings and Hideaway Forest School on Thursday mornings, as well as The Outdoors Project during school holidays. In October we will be offering a free, weekly after school outdoor activity session on Horfield Common for local school children, in partnership with Young Bristol. We are looking for volunteers and offering free training with Playful Bristol to help support this exciting new event, so please email us for more information.

If your organisation offers activities for children aged 8-12 years and you would be interested in leading a session, please get in touch with us, we'd love to talk to you.

Extending our plant nursery - We were very lucky to have a volunteer team from DAS UK Group here in September to help us extend our vegetable producing area and develop an area to provide more opportunities for therapy/wellbeing sessions. It will be used by visiting groups for therapeutic and educational horticulture sessions and to increase the amount of fresh food we can grow for food banks. The team of ten worked tirelessly during the day to move tonnes of topsoil and gravel to the new raised beds to give our volunteer gardeners a head start for autumn and winter planting. Volunteers make

all the difference; we can't thank you enough.

Halloween Spooktacular Party! - As this edition goes to print, we are finalising plans for our Halloween event on Saturday 28 October. Look out for posters on site and on our social media for details nearer the date. We are looking forward to another wonderful event for the whole family to

Friends of Horfield Common - You may have noticed that the green Horfield Common noticeboard outside The Ardagh has had more posters recently... that's because we're reinitiating the Friends of Horfield Common volunteer group!

We've been welcoming new volunteers to share their time and skills, to improve the Common and have fun in nature with their neighbours. We're looking for people in all roles: leading events, promotion, admin etc, but no contribution is too small - come and attend an event when you can!

Last month, we had our third FOHC meeting; at these sessions new and existing volunteers gather to share ideas for the Common. This is a great way to begin getting involved with the FOHC if you're interested! Our biggest event so far has been preparing the meadow patches for autumn. On a day of 30 degree heat, raking grass and mulching wasn't the easiest work, but it'll be worth it when the wildflowers bloom and provide an amazing ecosystem for the wildlife around Horfield.

In October, we have bulb planting to look forward to. our monthly Litter Pick (28 October, 10am) which is always popular with families, and the finishing of our survey of the benches around the Common, to see how we can get them all up to scratch.





For more than 30 years, The Children's Hospice South West (CHSW) has been dedicated to helping local families make the most of short and precious lives.

The charity has three hospices across the south west, supporting more than 500 families; Charlton Farm near Bristol supports more than 200 local children and young people with life-limiting conditions and their families with a range of free services, all available 24 hours-a-day, 365 days-a-vear.

Support for the whole family includes short breaks; specialist medical, palliative, emergency and end-of-life care; play and music therapy; activities for siblings; and bereavement support. During the Covid pandemic, the charity adapted its care model to extend support to families' own homes.

When Noa died at Charlton Farm in November 2018, aged three months old, the care, compassion and support the family received from the hospice helped give them the time and space they needed to say goodbye. Here mum, Jo explains why the family will be forever grateful to Charlton Farm for the vital help and support during Noa's life and after she had died.

"Me and my husband, Jim and our daughters Nellie, aged 3 and Ada aged 1 love coming together to visit Charlton Farm and reflect on the memories that we had with Noa. One thing that we love about the support at Charlton Farm is that, despite our girls not being born when Noa was here, members of staff have built lovely relationships with them to help them process and understand grief, having lost their sister they never met. It's incredible how they intentionally want to help support your grief for a long time after, even though our time there was so brief. We visit Charlton Farm every year on Noa's anniversary which is really special for us. It's really great getting to take them somewhere specific where they get attention and we get to mark Noa's anniversary and somewhere she actually



was. Our favourite place is the trees in the garden where we take photos, because that was the first place Noa was properly outside in her life."

CHSW needs around £11m a year to run its three children's hospices, and around 85 per cent is raised through voluntary donations. Their promise is to 'make the most of short and precious lives across the South West'. 



Have you enjoyed a ceilidh, perhaps at a party, and want to learn more?







Apple Day at Horfield Organic Community Orchard – celebrating 25 fruitful years

In 1998 members of Avon Organic Group (AOG) were looking for a site to plant a new community orchard in Bristol. One day, walking along the lane from Bishop Road to Longmead Avenue, Pauline Markovits, the woman with the inspiration for the orchard, spotted fruit trees in blossom on the other side of the allotment fence. Among the flowering trees was the apple that has come to be known as the Golden Hill Pippin.

Now a deep-rooted community food project, Horfield Organic Community Orchard (HOCO) invite all our readers to celebrate their 25th anniversary at this year's Apple Day on Sunday 22 October. Highlights include the Apple Tasting table, and human-powered juice pressing. Arrive early for homemade cake, fresh-pressed juice, and the pick of plants and preserves.

The sale of young fruit trees also raises funds for the orchard. Earlier this year, HOCO members, who are volunteers, took part in several grafting workshops. and have looked after the baby trees since then. Pre-ordering trees is highly recommended. See the HOCO website for more information.







Orchard member Shannon Smith says, "I'm pleased to report we'll have some Golden Hill Pippin trees for sale, along with many other HOCO favourites. It's a gorgeous looking and wonderful tasting apple. We're not sure if it's a one-off, but since HOCO rescued the abandoned allotment plots 25 years ago, this tree has been nurtured back to health and fruitfulness."

HOCO members are also delighted by news of a successful funding bid to the West of England Combined Authority's Community Pollinator Fund for a project called Bee Active, Bee Fruitful! Visitors to Apple Day will be able to see a proto-type wild beehive suited to small gardens installed in the Home Orchard Plot. More pollinator-friendly projects, along with opportunities for community volunteering, are planned in the coming months.

Update on St Andrew's Food Garden: Welcome to The Pod!



Yes, we now have a name! It's taken a while to find what feels like the right one, but we got there finally.

Over the last few months, The Pod has been really starting to flourish; it's been a joy to watch and participate in. The trees are healthy and doing well after being cut back hard in the spring.

The edible hedge has got off to a good start with all the plants doing well and many of them producing currants in their first season. The vines are creeping up the arch so are also very happy where they are. We didn't realise the arch would present itself as a very convenient football goal; the two children who told us this were very concerned and advised me earnestly to build a giant fence around the garden!





We're hoping it was a one-off because the plants seem to be fine.

We created a couple of new beds in the ground; Martin created a rich bed of courgettes, sweetcorn, artichokes and fennel, which is doing really well, and reveals how beautiful and not just functional, vegetable plants are. The

courgette and artichoke flowers are stunning! We want one of the ground level beds to have just one vegetable in it next year so we can grow a bigger crop. If you have any ideas for the best candidate, please tell us! We also want to plant pumpkins; if you are likely to have pumpkin plants next year that we could have, please let us know.

One of the most rewarding things about The Pod is the community of people enjoying it. Families with young children have been keeping the plants watered all summer with the watering cans that you'll find along the fence, and we've been told by so many parents that their children find it a magical space, which was exactly what we had hoped! 

Let me entertain you

Whether your pet has two legs, four legs, feathers or fur. they all need entertaining sometimes!

In this short article we hope to give you some tips on how to spend rainy autumn days (not to be used in place of a nice long wet walk). Finding what works for your pet is rather individual but we hope you can have some fun working it out together.

These enrichment activities are great for those pets convalescing after an injury (check the activities are injury-suitable), in isolation, helping with weight loss, behaviour, bonding and just spending some fun time with your pet.

Mealtimes no longer have to be boring... snuffle mats or puzzle feeders are a great way to exercise your pet's brain as well as being effective in slowing them down preventing them from inhaling their food too quickly. Between meals you can provide more food stimulation by filling Kongs with a low-fat treat or specialised filler/paste for your dogs or by freezing tuna spring water (avoid using tuna brine) for a fishy cat ice-lolly. For rabbits and other small furies, providing foraging opportunities by hiding food around their enclosure or makeshift maze will help tire your pets out without tiring you out.

How being charitable can reduce your inheritance tax bill

What are the basic rules of inheritance tax?

In the UK, inheritance tax is charged at a rate of 40% on assets (including money, property, possessions and investments) held over certain thresholds:

Every individual has a 'nil rate band' available to them. meaning you can have up to £325,000 of assets in your estate that will not be subject to inheritance tax. For married couples and civil partners, any unused portion of the nil-rate band can be transferred to the surviving partner, potentially doubling the tax-free allowance to £650.000.

One of the ways to do this is through gifting. Everyone is entitled to gift a certain amount of money away each year, and more when there is a special occasion such as a close family member getting married for example. Another type of gifting is legacy giving.

Legacy giving, also known as charitable bequests or planned giving, refers to the act of designating a portion of your assets, property, or financial resources to a charitable cause or organisation upon your death. It is a deliberate and thoughtful decision made during the estate planning process – stipulated in your Will, ensuring that your core values and passions continue to flourish even after you are no longer present.

The UK has a long history of philanthropy, with many of our most esteemed institutions, cultural landmarks and charitable organisations owing their existence and continued growth to the generosity of legacy gifts.

Allotments in North Bristol

Allotments, as we know them today, result from legislation starting in the mid-19th century, continuing into the mid-20th century. The Enclosure Acts of 1845 and later, were in part designed to create 'field gardens' for the landless poor, but the act failed. In 1887 the 'Allotment Act' meant that councils had to provide allotments if there was demand for them. but many resisted to comply. It is possible that the allotments in Ashley Down District, referred to in a newspaper in 1903, were formed following this act. The article says that it hopes further land will be made available in the north of the area. The Small Holdings and Allotments Act of 1907 and additional legislation in 1908, imposed responsibilities on councils to provide allotments. To the Victorians and Edwardians, allotments were seen as a way of keeping people active and away from the 'evils of drink', as well as providing fresh produce for families living in houses with no gardens.

The first series Ordnance Survey map. c1881, shows no allotments in North Bristol, but the second series, c1903 shows two designated areas. One was directly opposite the south end of Downend Park; today Muller Road runs through the site - this land had been pasture, and maybe the allotments mentioned in the 1903 newspaper article. The second allotments were behind Bristol (Horfield) Prison and may have served to provide food for the prison: this land had formerly been arable. Today this site forms part of the Golden Hill allotments.

The first allotments that we know something about were at Quab Farm. where Maple Road and Beloe Road now lie: these were laid out in c1909, but had disappeared under housing

by the early 1920s. The Golden Hill allotments were developed later in the early 1920s on adjacent land.

By 1914, there were approximately 500,000 allotments across England, but food shortages caused by Germany's blockage of shipping meant that more were needed, and the government gave local authorities powers to turn derelict land into allotments. The Horfield and District Allotments Association was formed in late 1916; their first allotments were off Filton Avenue - approximately where Bristol Rovers play today. People from the Horfield group were active in promoting allotments and developing and protecting the rights of allotment holders, across the Bristol area and beyond, as evidenced by newspaper reports.



One source of land, too small for general agriculture that was developed for allotments, was alongside

> railway lines and some of these were given to railway workers. At the end of the war there were an estimated 1.5 million allotments in England; in 1919, an act was passed to enable returning service men to get some of these. While demand for allotments was

> high, so was the demand for land for building and other purposes; some land was returned to its original use, often recreational, and other land was built on. An example would be the large allotment plot known as Graham's Field, south of Horfield Barrack. which ran from Gloucester Road to almost Filton Avenue, and from the Barracks to Highbury Road. Some land was repurposed for

building and Wessex Avenue was built down the middle, leaving two smaller sites that still exist today. Other sites in Upper Horfield that had been developed as allotments during and after WWI, were also built upon.

When WWII began there was a new drive to produce food supplies to alleviate the German blockades, with the Dig for Victory campaign and again spare land was turned into allotments, notably in Horfield much of Horfield Common, alongside Kellaway Avenue and down Wellington Hill West. The campaign, supported by posters and a song, was very successful; before the war Britain imported 75% of its food, by 1945 75% of food was produced in Britain and there were 1.4 million allotments.

News from Ashley, Bishopston & Ashley Down & Redland Councillors



Ashley Ward

You may have heard that St Paul's dentist, run by Bupa, closed its doors suddenly at the end of July, impacting many Bishopston residents. Since then, local community activists and I have been campaigning for a solution. We've been making good progress; we've been in contact with another dentist that

operates in Bristol and is interested in taking it over, and Sovereign Housing – the owners of the building – and Bupa are working with us to make this happen. Although nothing is confirmed yet, this should be welcome news to the local residents who have been left without access to dental care.

In news outside of Ashley ward, this month, the Labour administration approved investment into Bishopston Library to make it more energy-efficient, reducing CO2 emissions and saving the council money, which it could reinvest into our libraries. Residents will also see that work has begun on Ashley Down Train station, following the opening of Portway Park and Ride Station – the first new one to open in Bristol for almost a century – last month. This is great news for residents of Ashley ward, who will have another new sustainable transport option.

Emma in the ward and connecting with local residents. "I am delighted to be elected, I have already been listening to residents and I share many of their concerns. I look forward to meeting more of you in future and helping Emma with all the fantastic work she's been doing in the ward."

Ashley Down School Street – We were delighted to hear that the plans for a school street for Ashley Down School has gone ahead and is confirmed. The scheme will see Olveston Rd closed to traffic during term time on weekday mornings and at pick-up time. The scheme is due to start at the beginning of October. Emma has been working with the school and officers to get this implemented and we thank everyone who responded to the consultation. This will provide a much safer area around the school gates for drop off and pick-up time, as well as reducing pollution outside the school.

Muller Road project – Sadly, we have been told that the Muller Road project completion date has been pushed back again, due to contractors running into unforeseen issues with utility cables. We have been putting pressure on the council to engage in better resident communication about this as this has been the fourth delay in six months. We have been told that the new estimated date for completion is 4 October, but we will keep residents informed if this is due to change. The changes will see a new bus gate on Muller Rd, new traffic signals at the bottom of Ralph Rd and the final blocking off of Springfield and Brent Rds to prevent rat-running and through-traffic.

The Memorial Ground – Emma has had continued discussions with Bristol Rovers about the building work at the Memorial and sharing the concerns of local residents. They have agreed to host a series of community engagement events to discuss these concerns and to develop a better relationship with the community. At time of writing, we are preparing to take part in the first of these events on Thursday 21 September, at the Memorial Stadium. Residents will be invited along to discuss the building of the South Stand and any other concerns they have and learn more about the proposed stand. Further meeting dates will be announced.

Redland ward

Problems at the bottom of Gloucester Road - Fi met with the local PCSOs recently at their request to see how we can work together to reduce some of the problems occurring in the area. We've also had reports from residents who are concerned about a rise in some antisocial behaviour. Clearly there are no simple solutions to the increased prevalence of drug use, incidences of shoplifting and some abusive behaviours. Additionally, as we all know, resources everywhere are very stretched. Rather than simply trying to move the problem elsewhere, we have been in touch with council officers to see how support can be offered and long-term solutions found. The PCSOs are also keen to invite anyone interested to a (probably virtual) meeting to discuss how we can all work together on the issue. If you would be interested

Planning delays continue – Complaints from residents continue to arrive about lengthy planning delays, even for very simple applications. This frustrating situation has been drawn to the mayor's attention on many occasions, both by councillors and by residents via public forum statements made at full council meetings. The cause remains the loss of key staff and the inadequate funding to run the service.

in getting involved, please let Fi or Martin know.

The statutory period for deciding householder applications is within 8 weeks, unless a longer period is agreed in writing with the applicant. But, in August 2023, household applications were delivered in the timescale in only 18 out of 36 cases (i.e. 50%). We're assured that there are now new recruits in the team so we hope the situation will improve in the near future. Where applications are straightforward, we can try to get a rapid assessment if you send us details of a delayed application.

Electric vehicle charging – interest in electric vehicle use and charging continues to grow. We have been contacted by residents enquiring about installing, at their own expense, EV charging gullies (a strip where cables can be tucked away below the surface) outside their homes, similar to how dropped kerbs are agreed and paid for.

This appears to have accelerated since the Clean Air Zone started and is a good indication of people wanting to switch to cleaner vehicles. We recognise concerns over trip hazards – a genuine concern; groups representing disabled people will need assurances this won't be a risk.

The administration says gullies have been discussed with various groups and departments but are not deemed as a viable option. Their favoured option is to install



more on-street chargers and target areas where the chargers will be best utilised. The future of charging is hubs much the same as petrol stations. We hope this doesn't mean lengthy delays until new facilities are available.

Weed removal – We've previously referred in our news column to concern about the council spraying glyphosate to supress weeds. If a street wishes to opt out there is a procedure now to make a commitment to keeping the street weed-free, with a named resident to liaise with the contract manager. The council will reserve the right to get spraying carried out if a street isn't kept weed-free.

We have been trying to establish what progress is being made with the public commitment to cut spraying by half in time for 2030, in line with the council's Ecological Emergency Declaration. The actions on this will be reviewed later this year by the scrutiny commission Martin chairs.

Bristol Waste has recently been trialling a pivot away from the chemical spraying and using the team to manually remove the weeds. This is more labour-intensive, and the ground is covered more slowly, so it is not deemed viable when budgets are shrinking – hence the challenge for residents to work together in their own street.
