



The original Brunel Field library was in serious need of renovation. The bookshelves were too high for younger pupils to access, and were

> fixed in place so the space could not be adapted for group learning and other activities. The decor was muted and not at all inspiring. Well, this is certainly not the case now: it is such a happy place to be, bursting with colourful books inviting you to dive in. One wall has a glorious mural, perfectly capturing the great sense of adventure and escapism a good book can offer. Thanks go

to @silenthobo for the inspiring artwork.

Special thanks go to PSA parent, Cathy Wentworth. and her army of parent volunteers who packed, moved, unpacked, sorted and labelled books, rehomed and installed furniture, decorated, cleaned and organised the grand opening!

The library is now a versatile space, with a broadened selection of new library books and resources to reflect the diversity of the school community, including resources to support positive mental health and wellbeing. 





Jamie went on to explain that zoning is not always done by floor but can be used to separate areas such as a new extension, where the insulation will be of a higher standard and less heating is required.



## An open letter to every HMO (Professional or Student) landlord in Bristol

Trinity Academy launches its Sixth Form ready for September 2024

Trinity Academy is excited to be launching its sixth form this autumn ready for students to start in September 2024.

The new school opened in 2019 and moved into modern state-of-the-art facilities in September 2021. It has been oversubscribed since its opening and now has a full lower school. As part of the Cathedral Schools Trust, Trinity Academy sets a high standard of learning for its diverse school community and its mission for high academic teaching, a caring community and strong co-curricular offer resonates with the community.

Trinity is now looking to extend this mission and values to its sixth form which will open in purposebuilt facilities that have been designed to meet the needs of our post-16 students. Each institution will be involved in sharing their expertise and delivering part of the Dance. Drama and Music A Levels.

Headteacher Eiron Bailey says, "We are confident that our mission at Trinity translates into a first-class and unique 6th form provision where outstanding academic tuition is combined with high-level, individual support and a broad co-curricular offer. 6th formers at Trinity will have the opportunity to achieve both academic success and develop broader qualifications, whether this be within the performing arts or leadership arenas."

The first open event for the sixth form held on Wednesday 11 October was hugely successful with over 300 visitors. We anticipate a similar number of visitors to our second event on Tuesday 7 November 2023. We will be showcasing our first-class facilities including our newly furnished 6th form rooms as well as our outstanding teaching body who are on hand to answer questions about A level course content. Gloucester Road traders are looking forward to welcoming visitors to the North Bristol Art Trail this 25-26 November. Some venues, such as Future



School Council From













Hi all.

School is well and truly back, and the school council has been very busy. Our school council leader. Andrew, noticed the gardens at the back of school were, in his words, "RUBBISH"! The summer months had seen lots of brambles sprouting up and weeds growing in the grass. This vegetation spilling onto the paths was getting in the way of students trying to access the space in the autumn sunshine.

Andrew reported the issue to the gardeners and caretakers, and they said they would try hard to reduce the weeds in the half-term holidays when students will be at home. Andrew reported back and has gone on to inspire and encourage other

members of the student council and staff to get outside to try and tidy it

themselves. Students have been using loppers with help from support staff and holding bags to be filled with cut vegetation. "Good job, you can do it", says Andrew as he tries to motivate everyone. We found old strawberry plants under the hedges plus lots of bugs and creepy crawlies! We plan to plant some bulbs now to delight us all next spring. It is great to see students at Claremont taking an active role, expressing their opinions and trying to solve problems themselves.

Gardening is something we enjoy at Claremont and at the local Ardagh centre, on Horfield Common. We have two raised beds in the therapy space where we are taking control of the planting. We have already planted some broad beans to overwinter and some garlic. We are making a directory of plants, finding out about what conditions they like to grow in, how they grow and what they can be used for. We enjoy a good gossip with the volunteers and the general public in the cafe. We are learning new skills and using this experience as part of our Duke of Edinburgh award.

Back at school, the Foundation stage garden is looking "FANTASTIC" says Andrew. Staff developed this space last year with the younger students and they have colourful mobiles and a pop-up greenhouse.

## How being charitable can reduce your inheritance tax bill

#### What are the basic rules of inheritance tax?

In the UK, inheritance tax is charged at a rate of 40% on assets (including money, property, possessions and investments) held over certain thresholds:

Every individual has a 'nil rate band' available to them, meaning you can have up to £325,000 of assets in your estate that will not be subject to inheritance tax. One of the ways to do this is through aifting. Everyone is entitled to gift a certain amount of money away each year, and more when there is a special occasion such as a close family member getting married for example. Another type of gifting is legacy giving.

Legacy giving, also known as charitable bequests or planned giving, refers to the act of designating a portion of your assets, property, or financial resources to a charitable cause or organisation upon your death. ## Let me entertain you

Whether your pet has two legs, four legs, feathers or fur, they all need entertaining sometimes!

In this short article we hope to give you some tips on how to spend rainy autumn days (not to be used in place of a nice long wet walk). Finding what works for your pet is rather individual but we hope you can have some fun working it out together.

These enrichment activities are great for those pets convalescing after an injury (check the activities are injury-suitable), in isolation, helping with weight loss, behaviour, bonding and just spending some fun time with your pet.

Mealtimes no longer have to be boring... snuffle mats or puzzle feeders are a great way to exercise your pet's brain as well as being effective in slowing them down preventing them from inhaling their food too quickly. Between meals you can provide more food stimulation by filling Kongs with a low-fat treat or specialised filler/paste for your dogs or by freezing tuna spring water (avoid using tuna brine) for a fishy cat ice-lolly. For rabbits and other small furies, providing foraging opportunities by hiding food around their enclosure or makeshift maze will help tire your pets out without tiring you out.



## New Book Celebrating the life of David Foot



Award-winning West Country journalist and author, David Foot, came to Bristol in 1955 and lived in Cornwall Road. Bishopston, until moving to Redland and then Westburyon-Trym in 1966, where he lived until he died in 2021 at the age of 92.

On 4 October this year, at Gloucestershire County Cricket Club. the book

Footprints was launched. Footprints spans the full range of David's work - from cricket, football and boxing to theatre, local history and murder.

With an observant eye, a fascination with human nature and a felicitous way with words. David wrote with insight and freshness on a wide cast of characters: from cricketer Viv Richards and rugby star Carwyn James to actor Peter O'Toole, politician Harold Macmillan and poet Siegfried Sassoon.

This highly original book is both a collection of writing by a superb wordsmith and also the intimate story of how a boy from humble rural roots in Somerset overcame setbacks to become a writer, not only of beguiling prose but of wisdom,

## **Allotments in North Bristol**

Allotments, as we know them today, result from legislation starting in the mid-19th century, continuing into the mid-20th century. The Enclosure Acts of 1845 and later, were in part designed to create 'field gardens' for the landless poor, but the act failed. In 1887 the 'Allotment Act' meant that councils had to provide allotments if there was demand for them, but many resisted to comply. It is possible that the allotments in Ashlev Down District, referred to in a newspaper in 1903, were formed following this act. The article says that it hopes further land will be made available in the north of the area. The Small Holdings and Allotments Act of 1907 and additional legislation in 1908, imposed responsibilities on councils to provide allotments. To the Victorians and Edwardians, allotments were seen as a way of keeping people active and away from the 'evils of drink', as well as providing fresh produce for families living in houses with no gardens.

The first series Ordnance Survey map, c1881, shows no allotments in North Bristol, but the second series, c1903 shows two designated areas. One was directly opposite the south end of Downend Park; today Muller Road runs through the site - this land had been pasture, and maybe the allotments mentioned in the 1903 newspaper article. The second allotments were behind Bristol (Horfield) Prison and may have served to provide food for the prison; this land had formerly been arable. Today this site forms part of the Golden Hill allotments.

The first allotments that we know something about were at Quab Farm, where Maple Road and Beloe Road now lie; these were laid out in c1909, but had disappeared under housing

by the early 1920s. The Golden Hill allotments were developed later in the early 1920s on adjacent land.

By 1914, there were approximately 500,000 allotments across England, but food shortages caused by Germany's blockage of shipping meant that more were needed, and the government gave local authorities powers to turn derelict land into allotments. The Horfield and District Allotments Association was formed in late 1916; their first allotments were off Filton Avenue - approximately where Bristol Rovers play today. People from the Horfield group were active in promoting allotments and developing and protecting the rights of allotment holders, across the Bristol area and beyond, as evidenced by newspaper reports.



One source of land, too small for general agriculture that was developed for allotments, was alongside

railway lines and some of these were given to railway workers. At the end of the war there were an estimated 1.5 million allotments in England; in 1919, an act was passed to enable returning service men to get some of these.

While demand for allotments was high, so was the demand for land for building and other purposes; some land was returned to its original use, often recreational, and other land was built on. An example would be the large allotment plot known as Graham's Field, south of Horfield Barrack, which ran from Gloucester Road to almost Filton Avenue, and from the Barracks to Highbury Road. Some land was repurposed for building and Wessex Avenue was

built down the middle, leaving two smaller sites that still exist today. Other sites in Upper Horfield that had been developed as allotments during and after WWI, were also built upon.

When WWII began there was a new drive to produce food supplies to alleviate the German blockades, with the Dig for Victory campaign and again spare land was turned into allotments, notably in Horfield much of Horfield Common, alongside Kellaway Avenue and down Wellington Hill West. The campaign, supported by posters and a song, was very successful; before the war Britain imported 75% of its food, by 1945 75% of food was produced in Britain and there were 1.4 million allotments.

#### **Ashlev Down School Street**

We were both delighted to visit Ashley Down School at the beginning of October, to see how their new School Street was working out. The scheme sees Olveston Road closed to traffic from 8.30am to 9.10am on school day mornings, and 2.50-3.30pm in afternoons. The road is open to all pedestrians, cyclists, street residents and blue badge holders. The school and parents have been pushing for a School Street for a while and we have been delighted to support the scheme. The scheme is looking for volunteers; they need stewards to monitor the barriers at drop-off time and pick-up time. If you can spare time to do a weekly morning or afternoon slot once a week, then please contact Emma or James or Ashley Down Head, Amy Sood, directly.

#### Cycle hangar update

We know many residents in the ward are keen cyclists, and that one of the barriers to owning a bike can be a lack of places to securely store it. So, we are delighted that funding has been secured from central government's Active Travel Fund to install 80 new cycle hangars across the region. There is a public consultation to find out where, across the city, these hangars should go. So, if you think a hangar should go in your street, then do fill in the consultation and let your neighbours know about it. The council wants to make sure the decisionmaking around the location of the cycle hangers is driven by where there is the most need.

We have asked for more regular updates and for residents to be sent letters on the completed project. We have had reassurance that cars will be able to turn around at the bottom of Springfield Road. We will be keeping an even closer eye on the situation as it goes forward.

#### **Memorial Ground update**

Bristol Rovers and local residents about the new South Stand planning application. It was recently revealed that the Club withdrew their planning application as it was the wrong type; they have now resubmitted a new, more detailed, application that outlines the stand as a major development. The new application is now live and can be viewed on the council website for comment. Application number 23/03826/F.

#### Winter housing forums

The council is again hosting winter housing forums for council house tenants. At the winter forums, information will be shared about the actions the council is taking to manage and resolve damp and mould issues in council homes. Residents will also be able to get tips on what they can do to help manage these issues this winter. There will also be updates about developing plans to improve the way the council tackles anti-social behaviour, and the ongoing work around fire safety in high rise blocks.

#### Planning delays continue - but more staff in place

We still receive complaints from residents frustrated by lengthy delays in having planning applications processed. At the time of writing there are still over 1,500 applications waiting to be allocated to an officer. As you may know, the council has had a recruitment freeze in many departments but thankfully this was lifted to allow the recruitment of ten new officers. As a result, the number of applications waiting has started to come down very gradually but it will still take time to clear the backlog. We realise how distressing this is, and we will do what we can to help if you have a planning application that is particularly urgent.

#### Cycle hangars consultation - closes 29 October

We know many people said they wish they could park bikes safely and conveniently but have no accessible storage in flats or terraced streets. This can deter regular cycle use. New storage hangars (for up to six standard bikes), have been funded in the West of England from government to install 80 sites across the region. This region has been the most popular trial area in the whole country under the old Voi scheme, with millions of journeys made. But the council has asked for tighter controls on parking. One hundred new locations are planned across the region. Tier will also offer e-bikes for hire and some e-cargo bikes for businesses to use, all with a new turquoise colour scheme. We hope the switchover is smooth.

Clearly there are no simple solutions to the increased prevalence of drug use, incidences of shoplifting and some abusive behaviours. Additionally, as we all know, resources everywhere are very stretched. Rather than simply trying to move the problem elsewhere. we have been in touch with council officers to see how support can be offered and long-term solutions found. The PCSOs are also keen to invite anyone interested to a (probably virtual) meeting to discuss how we can all work together on the issue. 


