

Christmas is coming! This year, in view of the increased pressure on family budgets for buying enough food and power, we are not collecting/buying presents as we are concentrating

on Christmas food and drink treats (though NO ALCOHOL please).

So, as well as our normal requests for everyday food items, we hope for donations of chocolate coins, boxes of biscuits, sweets/chocolates, mince pies, Christmas puddings (no brandy or nuts), snacks (no nuts please) and vegetarian gravy granules, stuffing mix and bread sauce mix, also nice toiletries for women, men, teenagers and children as well as our usual toiletries, nappies and feminine hygiene products.

Please consider getting together with others in your street and arranging a collection of Christmas goodies to support our families and children in food poverty in North Bristol. We will be collecting every





next to the Café on the Common.

Our last deliveries are 12 December (May Park school) and 19 December for our four other community partners. We hope we get lots of lovely Christmas treats for the families we help to support. Many thanks in anticipation for your generosity ahead of the festive season.

We have had some great support recently from local businesses and from people running fundraising activities such as yard sales and street parties, but we still have an imbalance between our income and what we are spending. Everything you donate goes to buying fresh fruit and vegetables and dairy products. as well as a small amount of meat for specific partner organisations. All our work is done by volunteers, so you can be sure that your donations are supporting the people that need help to eat! It is shocking to think that in our society that this is an issue!

Our food clubs use our donations to put together bags of food and toiletries for their members. A bag of food is worth around £20-25 and the food club members pay £3.50 to receive a bag. The people attending food clubs are unable to afford to feed their families on their income, despite some of them being in important jobs like teaching or the NHS.

beautifully and it's a lovely, jolly thing to do with pals. Children are welcome. Booking is essential; please find full details on our website.

The days are darker but we don't close in winter: the Wednesday volunteers and our children's groups are in the garden all year round. Our Wednesday volunteers take the edge off the colder months by cooking up a delicious soup with our veg from the plot; coming together each week and chopping and chatting and then slurping down hot soup always puts a smile on faces. Every year we make sure to grow loads of parsnips and leeks and greens, lots of good stuff to feed us through winter. In previous years we've planned for a mild December and have always sowed our broad beans so they don't get so big that they get battered by the cold winds in Jan/Feb. However, 2022's ferociously cold December took us by surprise, and wiped out our celeriac, beans and indoor salads. So, in 2023 we have planned for both mild and cold weather this year, with a set of early planted and late planted beans and protection for our salads in the polytunnel, but who knows what the season will bring?

We also spend the winter fixing, sorting, tidying, clearing, organising and catching up with all the jobs we don't have time for in summer.


It's good to have a reason to be outdoors at this time of year. I always feel like every bit of fresh air makes the short days more bearable. So, if you'd like to come and get involved, please feel very welcome! We're here every Wednesday, 10am-4pm (though we close at 3pm in December and January), and new folks can come along for a tour and a chat at 12 or 2.30pm, or pop in when you can. No need to come every week or stay all day.

Can you make gifts if you are an Attorney or a Deputy? What you need to know

Attorneys and deputies play a crucial role in managing someone else's financial and personal affairs. Making decisions about gifts is an important aspect of their responsibilities and can impact their relationship with the donor's family and friends.

A Power of Attorney (POA) empowers individuals to appoint trusted family or friends to handle their financial and sometimes personal matters when they are unable to do so due to various reasons, such as illness or old age. The appointed person is referred to as the 'attorney' and must be someone the donor trusts implicitly, as they will manage the donor's entire estate, including cash, investments and property. A POA is established while the donor is of sound mind and can be used immediately or when the donor becomes incapable of managing their affairs.

Aguardianship order is established when an individual has already lost capacity, and there is no existing POA. This process involves the Court of Protection in deciding who will look after the individual's affairs. which can be a complex and costly endeavour. The court appoints a 'deputy' to oversee financial and welfare matters for the individual.

Understanding Gifts - Gifts are typically associated with birthday or holiday presents, but they can also involve lending money without interest, selling property below market value, or creating trusts and transferring assets. Although they may believe they are acting in the donor's best interest, there are limitations on making gifts.

Gift Rules - Attorneys and deputies can only make gifts under specific circumstances:

- To a family member, friend, or acquaintance on a 'customary occasion' (e.g. birthday, wedding, Christmas).
- To a charity.

In both cases, the gift must be of reasonable value relative to the donor's estate, and the attorney or deputy must act in the best interests of the donor. It's crucial to note that gifts cannot be made to evade care home fees

Making Larger Gifts – For larger gifts, attorneys and deputies must obtain authorisation from the Court of Protection before proceeding. They must present their case to the Court, outlining their proposals and reasons behind the gift.

De Minimis Exceptions - Under specific conditions, de minimis exceptions allow gifts without



Court permission when the person's estate is worth more than £325,000 (the current nil rate band). These exceptions cover the annual inheritance tax exemption of £3,000 and the annual small gifts exemption of £250 per person.

The conditions include:

- The person has a life expectancy of less than five years.
- Their estate surpasses the nil rate band for inheritance tax purposes.
- The gifts are affordable, considering care costs. and won't negatively affect their care and quality of life.
- There is no evidence that the person would object to such gifts being made on their behalf.

However, these exceptions do not apply to loans to the attorney or their family, investments in the attorney's business, sales or purchases below value, or transactions with a conflict of interest.

Careful Planning - Gifts made on behalf of another person can be complex and have the potential to cause rifts within a family. Although gifting is a legitimate way to reduce inheritance tax, planning should be done well in advance of it becoming an issue for an attorney or deputy - if possible.







Dances with live music are organised several times each year, by BWSCDC or by RSCDS, and





News from the Friends of Bishopston Library



Bishopston, like most libraries, welcomes a wide range of people. Browsers and borrowers, sitters and readers, students and toddlers - the list is endless. And possibly hiding in their midst is an author, researching and writing to create something that will ensure the library shelves are always stocked.

This was the case recently, when local author Rob Sheffield found a cosy spot in Bishopston Library to work on his recently published book. Pieces of Us. It tells the story of a small community near Swansea through interviews with residents, past and present.

On Tuesday 12 December, we will be holding an informal event book launch, when you can chat to Rob and find out more about the book and the community it describes. All are welcome to come along from 6.00 to 7.30pm. The event is free, and the Friends of Bishopston Library will be selling refreshments (cash only) in support of the library.



In this 'love letter to home'. Rob rediscovers a sense of identity and place - a heritage of thousands



of lives intertwined. Pieces of Us explores the knitting-together and pulling-apart of a family and a community. It provokes a timely conversation about wholeness. What's it like to live in a place where you're both seen and known – what does this unlock between us? And – conversely – what happens to us when we live somewhere but don't belong? This is a book about the formation, dismantlement and possible future of a particular working-class Welsh neighbourhood. But it's also a book about all of us.

Allotments in North Bristol

Allotments, as we know them today, result from legislation starting in the mid-19th century, continuing into the mid-20th century. The Enclosure Acts of 1845 and later, were in part designed to create 'field gardens' for the landless poor, but the act failed. In 1887 the 'Allotment Act' meant that councils had to provide allotments if there was demand for them, but many resisted to comply. It is possible that the allotments in Ashlev Down District, referred to in a newspaper in 1903, were formed following this act. The article says that it hopes further land will be made available in the north of the area. The Small Holdings and Allotments Act of 1907 and additional legislation in 1908, imposed responsibilities on councils to provide allotments. To the Victorians and Edwardians, allotments were seen as a way of keeping people active and away from the 'evils of drink', as well as providing fresh produce for families living in houses with no gardens.

The first series Ordnance Survey map, c1881, shows no allotments in North Bristol, but the second series, c1903 shows two designated areas. One was directly opposite the south end of Downend Park; today Muller Road runs through the site - this land had been pasture, and maybe the allotments mentioned in the 1903 newspaper article. The second allotments were behind Bristol (Horfield) Prison and may have served to provide food for the prison; this land had formerly been arable. Today this site forms part of the Golden Hill allotments.

The first allotments that we know something about were at Quab Farm. where Maple Road and Beloe Road now lie; these were laid out in c1909, but had disappeared under housing

by the early 1920s. The Golden Hill allotments were developed later in the early 1920s on adjacent land.

By 1914, there were approximately 500,000 allotments across England, but food shortages caused by Germany's blockage of shipping meant that more were needed, and the government gave local authorities powers to turn derelict land into allotments. The Horfield and District Allotments Association was formed in late 1916; their first allotments were off Filton Avenue - approximately where Bristol Rovers play today. People from the Horfield group were active in promoting allotments and developing and protecting the rights of allotment holders, across the Bristol area and beyond, as evidenced by newspaper reports.



One source of land, too small for general agriculture that was developed for allotments, was alongside

railway lines and some of these were given to railway workers. At the end of the war there were an estimated 1.5 million allotments in England; in 1919, an act was passed to enable returning service men to get some of these

While demand for allotments was high, so was the demand for land for building and other purposes; some land was returned to its original use, often recreational, and other land was built on. An example would be the large allotment plot known as Graham's Field, south of Horfield Barrack. which ran from Gloucester Road to almost Filton Avenue, and from the Barracks to Highbury Road. Some land was repurposed for building and Wessex Avenue was

built down the middle, leaving two smaller sites that still exist today. Other sites in Upper Horfield that had been developed as allotments during and after WWI, were also built upon.

When WWII began there was a new drive to produce food supplies to alleviate the German blockades, with the Dig for Victory campaign and again spare land was turned into allotments, notably in Horfield much of Horfield Common, alongside Kellaway Avenue and down Wellington Hill West. The campaign, supported by posters and a song, was very successful; before the war Britain imported 75% of its food, by 1945 75% of food was produced in Britain and there were 1.4 million allotments.

News from Bishopston & Ashley Down & Redland Councillors

Bishopston & Ashley Down ward

The Memorial Ground – The planning application for the South Stand at the Memorial Ground was approved at a DCA planning committee on 15 November. Emma shares, "I am happy for the club and the fans at this decision, especially the increase in capacity for disabled supporters and improved accessibility the new stand will provide. However. while there are clear benefits, as a ward councillor my primary job is to represent residents, some of whom have been treated appallingly throughout this process and whose valid frustrations have been used to score cheap political points. While this application has been approved, Councillors from across the chamber expressed their disappointment in the lack of community engagement from the club. Going forward, I hope that the club honours its promises to improve engagement with local residents and fulfils the obligations it has promised to the community."

Ashley Down train station - In early November we met with stakeholders and officers to get an update on the new Ashley Down train station. They updated us on the project and the work going on over the Christmas period so that the train station can be completed by its spring completion date. We raised residents' concerns about parking in the area and asked that this be looked into, and have been assured that they will have a drop-off zone but they do not expect any additional parking pressures. We intend to monitor this closely and feed back if this is not the case. We also fed back concerns about the ongoing closure of Concorde Way and asked if any solutions to widening the path could be looked at again. If you are reading this in time, the project is having drop-in sessions for residents on 28 November, 4-8pm, at the Station Compound. Station Road, accessible from Muller Road (just under the bridge towards Eastville).

Muller Road – We have been in contact with the transport officers about the Muller Road project and have been given a completion date of the end of November. The latest update is that letters will go out to residents about the new changes and when roads will open again as well as information about the closed roads. We have repeatedly raised concerns about the delays and have been told that these are down to supply chain issues and work stopping due to bad weather. Specific concerns have been raised with us about people cutting through the now closed Brent roads and have

called for a collapsible bollard to be installed, which would prevent cut throughs but allow for emergency services. We have been told that new



signs are to be installed in the next couple of weeks and their effectiveness will be closely monitored. If these do not work, we will continue to push for the installation of bollards.

New surgery times - Now James has settled into his new role as councillor we will be starting up surgeries again! As the nights have drawn in, we have been looking for a new venue as it is too dark to use the Ardagh in winter. We have also decided to add a second, online surgery to make our surgeries as accessible as possible to all residents. So, from December, our surgeries will be 4-6pm on the second Friday of the month at The Horfield Quakers Meeting House on Gloucester Rd, and on Zoom at 6-7pm on the second Monday of the month. If you would like to book a slot or come to our online surgery, please drop us an email. Our inperson surgery will also be open to drop-ins, though there may be a wait. We look forward to seeing you at one of our drop-ins soon. We will also be door knocking on Monday nights so we can listen to the issues that are affecting you and your communities.

Redland ward

Recycling update – Changes to some recycling and bin collection days. To make rounds more reliable and even out the workload some changes are planned by Bristol Waste. Just over 500 addresses in the ward are getting a new collection day and a handful are moving from weekly bins and recycling to weekly recycling and fortnightly bins, in line with the norm for the city. Letters should have been delivered to affected addresses.

If you're affected by the change to your collection day, please think about sharing the new day with

others in your street. If your black wheelie bin collection (residual waste) is moving from weekly to a fortnightly service then for a limited period, until 13 December only, you can get new recycling boxes delivered for free (if you order them). This should be explained in a letter to affected addresses. About 40% of what is typically in black bins can be recycled according to local waste analysis, so extra recycling boxes could save valuable materials and help deal with the switch.

Bishop Rd traffic – We've reported before how we're talking to Bishop Rd school, the police, and residents about traffic problems around the school on this busy route.

We're glad to say the council's enforcement team have agreed to work with local PCSOs to tackle dangerous car use and parking at pick-up and drop-off times at Bishop Road school. Fi and Martin are still pressing for the school streets scheme that we have been promised, though this will only be for some streets north of Bishop Rd. However, in the meantime, some monitoring and patrols may help reduce some of the problems that residents and school users have been reporting.

Anti-social behaviour at Gloucester Rd/Elton Rd junction — We've been able to get council officers to take part in a walkabout with police on this part of Gloucester Road by the Sainsbury's corner to assess the situation and see what can be done to improve matters in the area. Residents continue to raise concerns with us over threatening behaviour and we have recently talked to the manager of the supermarket who has agreed to get involved. We'd like to see fly-tipping managed better on the store's land. There is no magic bullet but we are hoping that by sharing information we can understand better what's going on and work together to improve matters.

Planning applications – Our ward doesn't have much development as large sites aren't common, but several proposals are currently affecting residents.

Martin has been offering support for residents affected by the third successive proposal for the site at 102 Gloucester Rd – the former NEG site on Berkeley Rd. After originally gaining planning permission for mixed uses including nine flats, followed by permission for mixed uses and fourteen flats, a new proposal has been lodged for ground floor mixed uses plus nine Houses in Multiple Occupancy comprising fifty-seven bedrooms.

It's not uncommon for a developer to make multiple applications for the same site, even when they already have permission for development.





There are still very long delays for most applications even to be allocated a case officer to handle the planning proposals. Do contact us if you've any queries relating to the ward.

Cranbrook Rd crossing — We're sorry to say getting the promised crossing built here with funds we secured has been an inordinately long saga — in common with most local highway schemes across the city. The legal Traffic Regulation Order for changes to highway rules is now completed, so officers are working on the details to submit to a contractor for construction of the traffic island crossing.

Due to serious cost inflation, the council is trying to secure a new list of contractors and agree realistic prices, but for now the department has agreed to absorb some escalated costs so we're relieved to say the project should be ok. They are working on getting the scheme ready for delivery although, regretfully, a construction timeline can't be promised yet.

Potholes and drains — With bad weather upon us we're getting more reports of blocked drains and autumn leaves. Please do remember to report these via the BCC website at https://www.bristol.gov.uk/residents/streets-travel/report-a-street-issue

If you haven't already done so, please also remember to cut back overgrown hedges to your boundary to help keep pavements clear.
